UCNJ EMT Program Pre-requisites and Orientation

All lectures and skills will be held face-to-face on the Plainfield Campus located at 225 Roosevelt Ave. Plainfield, NJ 07060. Field experience hours are scheduled by the students at local EMS Agencies and through the coordinator for Hospital Emergency Department hours. The college currently has articulation agreements with HMH at JFK Medical Center, Raritan Bay Perth Amboy, Raritan Bay Old Bridge, and Rahway Hospital.

Pre-requisites: Presented by 1st Day of Class

1. Professional Level CPR: State approved CPR cards can be found at: https://www.nj.gov/health/ems/documents/CPR%20Approved%20Certifications%205_3_2024.pdf
NOTE: CPR Programs that are online only and have no in-person skills sessions do not meet the state standards and are therefore, not valid to fulfill course pre-requisite.
2. Medical Clearance Form: Students must be medically cleared by their healthcare professional. See posted form.
3. COVID Vaccination: Students must provide proof of vaccination.
4. Clearance for Fit-Testing: Students must have a medical professional attest to the student's ability to be fit tested for n95 masks that are required for field observations. See posted form.

Registration Process

1. Complete the online UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ application at: <https://www.ucc.edu/admissions/apply/>. If you are under 18 the application process will be through the bridge program at <https://www.ucc.edu/admissions/admissions-process/high-school-dual-enrollment/>.
2. Complete course registration with student services.
3. Come to register and make payment. If you are a member of a volunteer emergency squad and are using a NJ Training Fund Form as payment, please contact Ms. Merissa Codiot in student services at: merissa.codiot@ucc.edu.

NOTE: Please give each TF candidate 2 signed (original) forms. One should be handed in to the registration office for payment and the other given in at orientation.

Orientation
