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PROGRAM MISSION STATEMENT

The Physical Therapist Assistant Program transforms our community by preparing highly qualified, entry-level professionals who promote safe and ethical professional practices within the scope of Physical Therapy. The Program is committed to excellence in providing an evidence-based Physical Therapy education, encouraging graduates to continue pursuing lifelong learning and relevant professional contributions.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Effective Spring 2024, the Union College Physical Therapist Assistant (PTA) program will no longer admit new students in the Spring semester. Beginning in Fall 2024, new students will be admitted in the Fall semester only. The deadline for submission of applications for the Fall 2024 admission cycle is March 15, 2024. Applicants must complete all admission requirements listed below to be considered for admission for the Fall 2024 Semester:

- Successful completion of pre-requisite courses in English Composition I (ENG 101), Anatomy and Physiology I (BIO 105), Algebra (MAT 119), and General Psychology (PSY 101), with a grade of C or better before the application deadline. The date of completion of BIO 105 must be within ten years of the application date.
- Completion of 20 observation hours; the observation form must be completed by a Physical Therapist (PT) or a Physical Therapist Assistant.
- Successful completion of the HESI exam.
- Union County residents who meet the minimum admission criteria will be given priority.

Instructions for Application:

- 1) Students who are interested in applying to the PTA program must first apply to UC and select Health Science as their major
- 2) To apply to UC, go to Apply

- 4) Please submit your official transcripts from all schools attended in sealed envelopes to Admissions Office, Cranford Campus 1033, Springfield Avenue, Cranford, NJ 07016
- 5) The admissions office must perform an official evaluation of transfer credits. If there are questions about applying to UC, selecting courses, or transferring credits, please get in touch with a Student Service Specialist in Student Service Center on Plainfield Campus at 908-412-3550, or you can access https://www.ucc.edu/academics/transfer-assistance/
- 6) Students must also complete the PTA application and submit the completed application along with **unofficial transcripts** from all schools attended CLEP, and AP scores, if

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applicable, for review by the PTA admissions committee by emailing it to PhysicalTherapist@ucc.edu or by mailing it to:

- 7) All students must complete twenty observation hours in an acute care hospital, acute rehab hospital, skilled nursing facility, or outpatient physical therapy facility before applying to the program. Each facility/PT/PTA must be provided the letter accompanying the admission packet. The student must have the physical therapist/therapist assistant they have followed for twenty hours complete the observation rubric. The PT/PTA is requested to fill out the rubric confidentially, seal it in an envelope, sign along the seal, and provide it to the student. The student must provide a sealed envelope with their admission application. The admission application will be considered complete once the program receives a completed observation rubric. Information regarding the observation hours to the student, the clinician (PT/PTA), and the observation rubric, which is required to be completed by the clinician, is provided in the admission packet.
- 8) All students must complete the HESI exam to be considered for admission into the PTA program. Please refer to the HESI material attached to this application to obtain information on how to apply for the exam. Please refer to www.proctoru.com for additional information on how to complete the HESI exam. Every applicant must pay the \$70 required to complete the HESI exam.

All completed applications received between September 1, 2023, and March, 15, 2024 will be reviewed. An admission score will be calculated for each application per the attached rubric. Admission into the program is highly competitive and not guaranteed. All students must complete all requirements to be considered for admission into the PTA program before the application deadline of March 15, 2024. Only complete applications will be evaluated for admission into the PTA Program. Students needing clarification about the admission process should e-mail the program director at Sohal.Hallur@ucc.edu.

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Please note:

Students accepted into the PTA program must have medical health insurance, health clearance by a physician, malpractice insurance, first aid certification, CPR certification, drug testing, and a criminal background check. Federal and state laws preclude persons with specific criminal backgrounds from being in contact with children and patients. A felony conviction may affect a student's admission, placement in the clinic, and ability to attain state licensure. Please consult with Student Specialist or the Program Director with any questions.

Retention of Application Materials:

Application materials submitted to the PTA program become the property of Union College and will not be returned to the applicant.
