

SUMMARY: As one of New Jersey's largest Hispanic serving institutions, Union County College has over 4,000 students of Latin heritage. Dedicated to providing everyone the opportunity to better their lives through education, Union County College has made graduation our number one priority. Over the past four years graduation rates have more than tripled. However, the increase among our Latino students has not kept pace with the general populations. We have made supporting these students an institutional priority.

THE PLAN: To develop a new Foundation fund that will have a direct and immediate impact on student success. The fund will be used to provide scholarship support to Hispanic students who are on track to graduate with a minimum GPA of 2.0. This fund will be managed by the Foundation office with advisement from faculty, staff and key volunteers.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES: To see a dramatic increase in overall graduation rates among our Hispanic full-time first-time students for the 2017 - 18 academic year.
