MINUTES

On motion duly made by Mr. Castro and seconded by Mr. Katz, the Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of September 17, 2024 were approved as submitted.

COMMUNICATIONS

Dr. Segal stated there were no communications.

INSIDE THE COLLEGE

Dr. Lown introduced Dr. Michele Rotunda who provided a presentation on History 290. History 290 is a program where students act as interns in the archives for the College.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

Dr. Lown addressed the members of the Boards highlighting some of the events that are currently taking place at the College:

• The Union County College Foundation hosted its 32nd Annual Scholarship Gala raising more than \$210,000.

- UCNJ hosted an Aspen tailgate for students to enjoy food, receive gifts and group into teams and participate in a quiz. The tailgate opened with remarks by Dr. McMenamin, who explained the Aspen Prize.
- Trustee Mary Zimmermann and Dr. Rotunda received the 2024 Northeast Region Trustee Leadership and Faculty Award and received Resolutions from the New Jersey Legislature at the Board Meeting.
- UCNJ students and staff attended the Brave Solutions Fueling Our Economic Future event held at the United Nations in New York City.
- President McMenamin has been named to the 2024 NJBIZ Education Power 50, which profiles the most influential education professionals in New Jersey.
- The Union County Board of County Commissioners hosted a Hispanic leadership event for members of the community and UCNJ students.
- The College's Social Sciences, Business, and History Division celebrated the 250th anniversary of New Jersey's role in the American Revolution.
- The Career Services Department hosted a job fair on the Elizabeth Campus for students to explore career paths, connect with potential employers, network and secure internships or job opportunities.
- In celebration of Giving Tuesday, the Union County College Foundation is challenging both the UCNJ and Union County community to raise \$10,000 for the College's Nourish the Future campaign.
- There were two important visits: Chair of the Middle States team who met with a number of people to discuss the Self-Study in advance of the team visit in February. The visit went well; Aspen team visit, who visit the top 10 finalist and from all indications it was an extremely successful visit.
- Former Board of Governors member and longtime supporter of the College, Frank Raudelunas, passed away.

On behalf of Dr. McMenamin, Dr. Lown thanked the Board Members for their strong support of the College and students. She stated that we have wonderful things happening as a result of your leadership.

REPORTS OF JOINT TRUSTEES AND GOVERNORS' COMMITTEES

AUDIT COMMITTEE

Mr. Hehl stated that at the Audit Committee Meeting held earlier, three internal audits were performed by PKF O'Connor Davies. They were a review of Stafford Loans, Public Safety Department and Policy Governance. Mr. Hehl reported that with a few minor issues, there were no exceptions reported.

Mr. Hehl presented the following Resolution for approval:

Resolution A025-001 - Acceptance of FY2025 Internal Audit Plan

WHEREAS, the College utilizes professional auditing services, in support of the mission of the College, and

- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a. (15) provides for awarding of contracts for professional consulting services without public competitive bids, and
- WHEREAS, PKF O'Connor Davies Advisory, LLC, Harrison, NY will audit three areas and follow up on findings from 2023/2024 during Fiscal Year 2024-2025. The three areas that will be audited include 1) Executive Compensation and Benefits 2) Data Integrity, and 3) Budget and Forecasting at a cost not to exceed \$18,750, and
- **WHEREAS**, the cost for the internal auditing services for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 was \$35,243, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq. provides that the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceed \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, PKF O'Connor Davies Advisory, LLC, Harrison NY has completed and submitted Business Entity Disclosure and Political Contribution Disclosure Certifications, certifying that they have not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the one year previous to their contract award, and that they will be prohibited from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ award a contract to PKF O'Connor Davies Advisory, LLC, Harrison, NY to perform internal audit services as described above for a total cost not to exceed \$30,750 for work to be performed during Fiscal Year 2024-2025.

EDUCATIONAL PLANNING AND POLICY COMMITTEE

Mrs. Zimmermann stated to the Board that at the Educational Planning and Policy meeting held earlier, Dr. Lown reported that Excelencia recently recognized UCNJ's Experiential Center for Education and Leadership (ExCEL) program, funded by a Title V Developing Hispanic-Serving Institutions grant, as a 2024 Program to Watch. She stated that the ExCEL program is supporting three students to attend the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (HACU) 38th Annual Conference Adelante Leadership Institute. Mrs. Zimmermann reported

that Dr. Ziner presented the Fall Enrollment Report for 2020-2024, and enrollment for Winter is -44.6% in FTE hours.

WHEREAS, a College policy is a prescribed institutional course of action, a guiding principle, or a procedure intended to enhance strategic goals; reduce institutional risks; improve internal controls; establish delegation of authority and responsibility;

promote compliance with federal, state and other applicable laws and regulations; further operational alignment, consistency, or efficiency; and/or influence and determine decisions, actions, conduct, and other matters at the College, and

WHEREAS, the College's Policy on Policies sets forth that the Board of Trustees or the President serve as the "Approval Authority" for College-wide policies, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ approves the revisions to the following policies attached as Exhibit 1: 300-16 Incident Reporting Procedure for Faculty, 300-27 Residency Policy, 400-1 Bank Depository Policy, 400-3 Refund Policy, 400-4 Travel Policy, 400-5 Reserve Policy, and 600-9 Substance Abuse Policy.

SAFETY REPORT

Dr. Lown stated that in compliance with the Cunningham – Ruiz Law (S485, codified at N.J.S.A. 18a:3B-71) requiring reporting of campus crimes and fire incidents for the period from August 30, 2024 through October 1, 2024, Public Safety advised that there was a report of a simple assault of student as a result of a road rage incident that began on the Garden State Parkway. The incident is under investigation by the Cranford Police Department.

BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

Mr. Campbell stated that the Budget and Finance Committee met earlier and reviewed the Investment Report and reported that all investments are found to be in order and are within acceptable norms.

Financial Report:

Mr. Campbell reviewed the Investment Report and reported that variances within the report are due to the following: an increase in Fall enrollment which impacted tuition revenue and student receivables; the net increase in expenses, primarily driven by the various contract negotiations, rising healthcare premium, and expected annual increases in software and other operating expenses.

Current Estimate Report:

Mr. Campbell reviewed the Current Estimate Report and stated that at this time, a transfer from Unrestricted Net Position of \$1.4 million is anticipated for fiscal year ended June 30, 2025:

Resolution F025-001 - Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Grant ("Perkins")

- WHEREAS, UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ, as a comprehensive community college, seeks to provide career occupational training programs designed to assist UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ students and other Union County residents to become employed, and
- **WHEREAS,** the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Grant is a Federally authorized grant whose aim is to increase the academic achievement of career and technical education students and strengthen the connections between secondary and postsecondary education, and
- WHEREAS, on October 8, 2024, the College submitted the final phase of its Spending Plan in substantially approvable form to the State of New Jersey, Department of Education in the application process for Perkins grant funding for the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2025, principally covering related personnel, materials and supplies, instructional equipment, travel, and other costs, and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Department General Administrative Regulations (EDGAR), 34 CFR Part 76.708, the College may begin to obligate these funds the later of the program duration start date of July 1, 2024, or the date the application was received by the State in substantially approvable form, and
- **WHEREAS,** the State of New Jersey, Department of Education requires that eligible recipient's governing body formally accept all funds awarded under the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Grant, and
- WHEREAS, on October 8, 2024, the State of New Jersey, Department of Education notified UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ that its Perkins application was awarded and "approved" for the amount of \$912,461;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ accepts \$912,461 in funding from the State of New Jersey, Department of Education for the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Grant for the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2025.

Resolution F025-002 - County College Based Center for Adult Transition Grant

WHEREAS, UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ as a comprehensive community college, seeks to enhance the lives of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities by providing transitional services, peer mentoring, educational opportunities, career exploration and linkage to community services, and

- WHEREAS, the College applied to the State of New Jersey, Office of the Secretary of Higher Education ("OSHE") for the County College Based Center for Adult Transition Grant to provide students up to the age of twenty-four, who have developmental disabilities, the support and resources necessary to experience more successful transitions from secondary school to postsecondary education and adult employment, and promote independent living opportunities by providing appropriate skills to be successful, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Center will support the educational mission of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ by creating an inclusive community that meets the diverse needs of students through advocacy, equitable access, support, and resources, and
- **WHEREAS,** the College will engage a cohort of students, who are able to administer their own medication if applicable, have the capability to attend to their personal hygiene, have a strong desire to become an independent adult, and possess sufficient emotional stability to participate successfully, and
- WHEREAS, UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ received notification that funding in the amount of \$202,570 was awarded for the period July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025, by the State of New Jersey, Office of the Secretary of Higher Education ("OSHE") for the County College Based Center for Adult Transition Grant;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ accepts the funding of \$202,570 from the State of New Jersey, Office of the Secretary of Higher Education ("OSHE") for the County College Based Center for Adult Transition Grant for the period July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025.

Resolution F025-003 - College Readiness Now XI Grant

- **WHEREAS,** UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ, as a comprehensive community college, seeks to provide opportunities to increase college readiness of high school students prior to graduation, and
- WHEREAS, the College responded to an opportunity offered by the New Jersey Council of County Colleges (NJCCC) through a partnership with the New Jersey Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE). The program's priority is to identify students in the 9th through 12th grade, living below the poverty line who are not yet "college ready". Recipients of this grant are responsible for defining and documenting the methodology utilized to identify students who are living below the poverty line by using an assessment tool, and
- WHEREAS, UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ received notification from the New Jersey Council of County Colleges (NJCCC) that \$50,317 was approved for the College Readiness Now XI Grant for the period July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025, and

WHEREAS, the College will partner with various high schools in the area to recruit juniors and seniors for "college readiness" courses in the spring and summer semesters. The program in the spring will focus on strengthening student's math skills to prepare them for higher level math courses, and the program in the summer will offer courses in English 101 and 102 with both programs providing "college readiness" focused seminars for the students;

Resolution F025-004 - Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG)

- **WHEREAS,** UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ, is a comprehensive community college providing quality, affordable, accessible educational programs that serve the greater Union County region, and
- WHEREAS, the Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG) is the State of New Jersey's community college initiative that provides last dollar awards to New Jersey resident community college students who do not have a prior college degree, completed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the New Jersey Alternative Financial Aid Application according to agency deadlines, make satisfactory academic progress and have a total household adjusted gross income (AGI) under \$65,000 for free tuition, (AGI) \$65,001-\$80,000 for reduced tuition costs up to one-half of the maximum CCOG award, and for (AGI) between \$80,001 and \$100,000 for reduced tuition costs up to one-third of the maximum CCOG award, and
- WHEREAS, UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ has been notified that it was awarded \$376,569 for the Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG) Student Success Initiative funding to be implemented during the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025, by the State of New Jersey, Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE), and
- WHEREAS, the purpose of the partnership between the Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE) and the College is to increase matriculation and support the goals of the Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG) by implementing goals and strategies for capacity building and increasing enrollment, improving student completion and reducing financial burdens on students;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ accepts \$376,569 in funding from the State of New Jersey, Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE) for the Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG) Student Success Initiative Funding for the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025.

Resolution F025-005 - Hunger-Free Campus Grant

- WHEREAS, UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ, as a comprehensive community college is committed to eliminating hunger within the College community to ensure the wellbeing of its students. The College has multiple assistance programs in place to meet student's material needs, and actively seeks financial support from community organizations, individuals, corporations, foundations, and government sources for this effort, and
- **WHEREAS,** the College applied to the State of New Jersey, Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE) for the Hunger-Free Campus Grant, awarded pursuant to the Hunger-Free Campus Act, and
- WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey, Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE) is providing this grant funding to address student hunger, leverage more sustainable solutions to address basic food needs on campuses, raise awareness of currently offered campus services that address basic food needs, and continue to build strategic partnerships at the local, state, and national levels to address food insecurity among students, and
- **WHEREAS,** the College plans to use the funding from the Hunger-Free Campus Grant to ensure that students receive help with their basic needs such as food, supplies and transportation on the Cranford, Elizabeth and Plainfield campuses, and
- WHEREAS, the College received notification on October 10, 2024, that it was awarded \$49,000 from the State of New Jersey, Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE) for the Hunger-Free Campus Grant for the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ accepts \$49,000 from the State of New Jersey, Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE) for the Hunger-Free Campus Grant for the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025.

Resolution F025-006 - NJ Historical Commission Project Grant

- **WHEREAS,** UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ, as a comprehensive community college, seeks to strengthen enrollment by introducing innovative learning experiences to its students, and
- WHEREAS, the College applied to the New Jersey Historical Commission (NJHC) under the State of New Jersey, Department of State for a grant in the amount of \$13,932 to support "Student Voices at UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ: 1960s 1980s." to build on themes from a previous project, "Student Voices at Union College" that was part of the Smithsonian MOMS Voices and Votes exhibit at the College, and

WHEREAS, students will research and document civic events in the late 1960s through the 1980s with a focus on race issues, women's issues, the early gay rights movement, AIDS crisis and the Vietnam War, using college newspapers and other resources in the College archives, and

- **WHEREAS,** historical research produced from this project will be added to the UCNJ Archives finding guide, shared as a resource for humanities classes, and posted on the archive's website, and
- WHEREAS, UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ received notification from the New Jersey Historical Commission (NJHC) that \$13,932 was awarded for the NJ Historical Commission Project Grant, and
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ accepts \$13,932 in funding from the NJ Historical Commission under the State of New Jersey, Department of State.

Resolution F025-007 - ABLE PLUS Consortium State Funding Acceptance

- WHEREAS, UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ as a comprehensive community college, seeks to provide career occupational training programs designed to assist College students and other Union County residents to become employed, and
- WHEREAS, the College applied, as the lead agency of the WIOA Title II, ABLE PLUS Consortium, to the State of New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development (the "Department") for funding under the Workforce Investment Act of 1998, Title II, the Adult Education and Family Literacy Act, and
- WHEREAS, the ABLE PLUS Consortium ("Consortium") consists of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ as the lead agency, and three public education partners; Elizabeth Board of Education, Literacy New Jersey Union County Program, and Urban Workforce Advantage Inc., and
- WHEREAS, the purpose of the Consortium is to deliver Adult Basic Skills Programs that assist adults to become literate and obtain the knowledge and skills necessary for employment and self-sufficiency, to become full partners in the educational development of their children and complete a secondary school education, and
- WHEREAS, on June 20, 2024, the State of New Jersey, Department of Labor and Workforce Development notified UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ that the Consortium was awarded \$1,879,927 in pass through Federal WIOA funding, and the Board of Trustees accepted this funding at the September 17, 2024, Board Meeting, and
- **WHEREAS,** on September 17, 2024, the College was notified by the State of New Jersey, Department of Labor and Workforce Development that State funds of \$166,666

were being added to the original contract for Fiscal Year 2025 WIOA Title II Grantees, and

- WHEREAS, the College submitted a budget on September 27, 2024, for their additional share of State funding from the State of New Jersey, Department of Labor and Workforce Development, in the amount of \$166,666;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ accepts the State funding for the amount of \$166,666 from the State of New Jersey, Department of Labor and Workforce Development through June 30, 2025, for a total award of \$2,046,593.

Resolution F025-008 - Annual Renewal Jamf Software Licenses and Operating Supplies WHEREAS, the College requires the annual renewal of Jamf software licenses to authenticate

and manage Apple users and devices and Operating Supplies, in support of the mission of the College, and

- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a.(19) provides for an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids in the provision of goods or services for the use, support or maintenance of proprietary computer hardware, software peripherals and system development for the hardware, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.11a.a. authorizes County Colleges to be a participating contracting unit in a cooperative pricing system established pursuant to the laws of the State of New Jersey, and
- WHEREAS, on June 18, 2024, the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ awarded contracts to SHI International Corp., Somerset, NJ, for software licenses, network maintenance, and hardware at a total cost not to exceed \$1,875,515, for Fiscal Year 2024-2025, and

Campus Projects:

Mr. Katz reported on the updates to the Project Prioritization List as well as the various projects on all campuses.

Cell Tower Update:

Mr. Katz reported that the College was informed that an update should come by Thanksgiving and anticipate more concrete news by the December 10th Board Meeting.

Mr. Katz presented the following Resolution for approval:

<u>Resolution B025-001 - Authorization for Shared Services with Union County for Paving-Cranford Campus</u>

- **WHEREAS,** paving and trenching conduits for lighting and security upgrades are required throughout the Cranford campus, in support of the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-12.J. states that the Board of Trustees is authorized to enter into contract with the State or any of its political subdivisions which are deemed necessary or advisable by the Board, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq. permits county colleges to share services for particular purposes and to effectuate agreements for any service or circumstance that will aid and encourage a reduction of expenses, and

- **WHEREAS,** Union County will be issuing a bid for paving services that UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ is desirous of joining to obtain the collaborative benefits that can be offered through a shared services arrangement, including economies of scale and enhanced service delivery, and
- WHEREAS, in order to facilitate the procurement project, a Shared Services Agreement ("Agreement") by and between Union County and UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ will be prepared for the provision of services in connection with the paving bid, and
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ grants authority to participate in a Shared Services Agreement and procurement process with Union County for paving throughout the Cranford campus.

<u>Resolution B025-002 - Authorization for Funding of the Cranford Campus Physical</u> Education Center Renovation

- **WHEREAS,** the physical education facility on the Cranford campus needs renovation and expansion for this space to by fully utilized and operational. The facility does not meet athletic conference standards and the current configuration must be upgraded, in support of the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS,** the most recent estimate of the cost of the project is \$34.5 million, an increase in the amount of \$9.5 million from the prior estimate of \$25 million which is attributable to finalized design specifications and the increased cost of construction and raw materials, and
- WHEREAS, on February 25, 2020, the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ authorized renovations to the Cranford Campus Physical Education Facility Renovation and certified an amount of money for such purpose as \$5.580 million to be provided under the provisions of the Fiscal Year 2021 Chapter 12 funding, and
- WHEREAS, on February 23, 2021, the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ authorized renovations to the Cranford Campus Physical Education Facility Renovation and certified an amount of money for such purpose as \$5.578 million to be provided under the provisions of the Fiscal Year 2022 Chapter 12 funding, and
- WHEREAS, on February 22, 2022, the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ authorized renovations to the Cranford Campus Physical Education Facility Renovation and certified an amount of money for such purpose as \$4.264

- million to be provided under the provisions of the Fiscal Year 2023 Chapter 12 funding, and
- WHEREAS, on February 21, 2023, the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ authorized renovations to the Cranford Campus Physical Education Facility Renovation and certified an amount of money for such purpose as \$4.567 million to be provided under the provisions of the Fiscal Year 2024 Chapter 12 funding, and
- WHEREAS, on March 19, 2024 the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ authorized renovations to the Cranford Campus Physical Education Facility Renovation and certified an amount of money for such purpose as \$3.097 million to be provided under the provisions of the Fiscal Year 2025 Chapter 12 funding, and
- WHEREAS, the College has an interest in pursuing a request to the NJCCC for Fiscal Year 2026 Chapter 12 funding which at this time is estimated to be \$3 million based upon previous years, and
- **WHEREAS,** based on design specification changes and the increased cost of construction, it is estimated that the College will need to allocate \$8.5 million from reserves for completion of this project, and
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ hereby determines a) that an estimated \$34.5 million will be needed to renovate the physical education center on the Cranford campus, b) the College has received \$23.086 million under the provisions of Chapter 12 funding, c) the College estimates it will receive an additional \$4 million in Chapter 12 funding based upon previous years, and therefore, the College requires an additional estimated \$7.5 million to be allocated from reserves for completion of this project.

- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.11a.a. provides for awarding contracts without public competitive bids when there is a state recognized and accepted cooperative agreement for the product or service that has been publicly bid, and
- WHEREAS, on May 6, 2024, the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ awarded a contract to KGC Enterprises, Inc. T/A KC Sign, Aston, PA for exterior signage and installation on all campuses under Educational Services Commission of New Jersey (ESCNJ) Bid #21-26 at a cost not to exceed \$400,111, and
- WHEREAS, KGC Enterprises, Inc. T/A KC Sign, Aston, PA has provided an additional proposal under ESCNJ Bid #21-26 to add signage for MacKay Library, the Lessner building and for unforeseen conditions that arose while the project was

- being performed, which include corrosion and necessary extra repair work at a cost not to exceed \$60,000, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the value of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, ESCNJ utilized competitive bidding for the awards of contracts to KGC Enterprises, Inc. T/A KC Sign, Aston, PA, thereby releasing UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ from the requirement to obtain Pay-to-Play documentation, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ award a contract to KGC Enterprises, Inc. T/A KC Sign, Aston, PA for additional exterior signage and installation at a cost not to exceed \$60,000, for a total award not to exceed \$460,111.

<u>Resolution B025-005 - Engineering Design Services Paving and Trenching - Cranford</u> Campus

- **WHEREAS,** the College requires engineering design services for paving and trenching conduits for lighting and security upgrades on the lots throughout the Cranford campus in support of the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A-64A-25.5.a.(1) provides for an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids for professional services, and
- **WHEREAS,** Suburban Consulting Engineers, Inc., Flanders, NJ has submitted a proposal for engineering design services for the paving and trenching of the lots throughout the Cranford campus, including bid specification development and construction support, at a cost not to exceed \$79,150, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and

- WHEREAS, Suburban Consulting Engineers, Inc., Flanders, NJ has completed and submitted Business Entity Disclosures and Political Contribution Disclosure Certifications, certifying that they have not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the one year previous to their contract award, and that they will be prohibited from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ award a contract to Suburban Consulting Engineers, Inc., Flanders, NJ for engineering design services for paving and trenching on the Cranford campus at a cost not to exceed \$79,150.
