BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

Mr. Betancourt stated that the Budget and Finance Committee met earlier and reviewed the Investment Report and reported that all investments are found to be in order and are within acceptable norms.

Mr. Betancourt stated that Financial Report was also reviewed and reported revenue is up slightly due to an increase in credit hours year over year, and the net increase in total expenses year over year is a result of timing of expenses and the increase in compensation.

- **WHEREAS,** Mark G. Anderson, Director of Purchasing, is the designated Union College of Union County, New Jersey Contracting Agent and the current Public Agency Compliance Officer;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union College of Union County, New Jersey re-appoint Mark G. Anderson, Director of Purchasing, as the Union College of Union County, New Jersey Public Agency Compliance Officer for the calendar year 2023.

- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contract Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.10 provides authority for joint purchasing by county colleges, municipalities or counties or with other units of government pursuant to "Local Public Contracts Law," P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-1 et seq.), and
- WHEREAS, Noresco Sustainability Services, Edison, NJ issued a bid for natural gas supply and delivery service on behalf of the New Jersey Council of County Colleges Joint Purchasing Consortium (NJCCC JPC) for the twenty-four (24) month period of November 1, 2022 through October 31, 2024, and

WHEREAS, the awarded providers and estimated costs for the twenty-four (24) month contract period from November 1, 2022 through October 31, 2024 are as indicated below:

- WHEREAS, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that contracts arrived at through an open and fair process and the transmission of natural gas by vendors that are regulated by the Board of Public Utilities are exemptions to the Pay-to-Play law, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union College of Union County, New Jersey award a contract for natural gas supply to Constellation New Energy, Louisville, KY, and Direct Energy Business Marketing, LLC Philadelphia, PA at an estimated total cost not to exceed \$612,744 and \$93,000 respectfully from November 1, 2022 through October 31, 2024.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union College of Union County, New Jersey award contracts to Public Service Electric & Gas (PSE&G), Newark, NJ for the Plainfield and Scotch Plains campuses and to Elizabethtown Gas, Elizabeth, NJ for the Cranford and Elizabeth campuses for estimated natural gas delivery costs not to exceed \$69,120 and \$267,840 respectively from November 1, 2022 through October 31, 2024.

<u>Resolution F023-010 - Solid Waste Removal and Single Stream Recycling Management Services</u>

- **WHEREAS,** the College requires solid waste removal and single stream recycling management services on all campuses in support of day to day operations and the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS**, the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.11.a. provides for awarding contracts without public competitive bids when there is a state recognized and accepted cooperative agreement for the product or service that has been publicly bid, and
- WHEREAS, Direct Waste Services, Inc., Newark, NJ has submitted a proposal under Union County Cooperative Pricing System (UCCPS) contract BA#30-2022 to provide solid waste removal and single stream recycling management services from January 1, 2023 until December 31, 2025 for a total award not to exceed \$305,917, and
- **WHEREAS,** the cost for the same service for a twenty-four (24) month period from January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2022 is projected to be \$186,622, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, UCPS utilized competitive bidding for the award of the contracts to Direct Waste Services, Inc., Newark, NJ thereby releasing Union College of Union County, New Jersey from the requirement to obtain Pay-to-Play documentation, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union College of Union County, New Jersey award a contract to Direct Waste Services, Inc., Newark, NJ to provide to provide solid waste removal and single stream recycling management services on all campuses for a total cost not to exceed \$305,917 from January 1, 2023 until December 31, 2025.

Resolution F023-011 - Additional Temporary On-Call Custodial Staffing Services

WHEREAS, the College has a continued need for temporary on-call custodial staffing due to the number of staff vacancies for custodial shifts and effectuation of enhanced cleaning efforts on all campuses, in support of the mission of the College, and

- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a.(20) provides for an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids for personnel recruitment and advertising, and
- **WHEREAS**, the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.11a. provides for awarding contracts without public competitive bids when there is a state recognized and accepted cooperative agreement for the product or service that has been publicly bid, and
- WHEREAS, on June 21, 2022, the Board of Trustees awarded a contract to Delta-T Group North Jersey, Inc., Woodbridge, NJ to provide temporary on-call custodial staffing services at the rate of \$22.90 per hour for July 1, 2022 until December 31, 2022 for a total award not to exceed \$238,160, and
- WHEREAS, Delta-T Group North Jersey, Inc., Woodbridge, NJ has submitted an additional proposal under Educational Services Cooperative of New Jersey (ESCNJ) Co-op #ESCNJ 20/21-30 to provide temporary on-call custodial staffing services at the rate of \$22.90 per hour from January 1, 2023 until June 30, 2023 for a total award not to exceed \$238,160, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, ESCNJ utilized competitive bidding for the award of the contracts to Delta-T Group North Jersey, Inc., Woodbridge, NJ thereby releasing Union College of Union County, New Jersey from the requirement to obtain Pay-to-Play documentation, and
- **WHEREAS**, a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union College of Union County, New Jersey award a contract to Delta-T Group North Jersey, Inc., Woodbridge, NJ to provide temporary on-call custodial staffing services on all campuses to cover vacancies in custodial staffing and for enhanced cleaning efforts on all campuses at a cost not to exceed \$238,160 from January 1, 2023 until June 30, 2023 for a total award not to exceed \$476,320 for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

- WHEREAS, Karas Enterprises, Dba Karasch & Associates, West Chester, PA has submitted a proposal to provide CART services to students requiring real time in class translation at a cost not to exceed \$20,000 for the Spring 2023 semester, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4, et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- WHEREAS, Karas Enterprises, Dba Karasch & Associates, West Chester, PA has completed and submitted Business Entity Disclosures and Political Contribution Disclosure Certifications, certifying that they have not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the one year previous to their contract award, and that will be prohibited from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract, and
- **WHEREAS,** the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined the total contract award will exceed \$17,500 each, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union College of Union County, New Jersey award a contract to Karas Enterprises, Dba Karasch & Associates, West Chester, PA, for CART translation services at a cost not to exceed \$20,000 for a total award not to exceed \$40,000 for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a.(15) provides for an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids in the provision of goods or services for the use of professional consulting services, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.11.a. authorizes County Colleges to be a participating contracting unit in a cooperative pricing system established pursuant to the laws of the State of New Jersey, and
- WHEREAS, on June 21, 2022, the Board of Trustees awarded contracts to SHI International Corp., Somerset, NJ for software licenses, network maintenance and computer hardware in an amount not to exceed \$903,542, and
- WHEREAS, SHI International Corp., Somerset, NJ has provided hardware equipment at a cost of \$7,274 for Fiscal Year 2022-2023, which was under the threshold of \$7,500 for "Report of Authorized Payments in Excess of Original Award" which did not require Board of Trustee approval, and
- **WHEREAS,** the College has received Federal and State grant awards to cover costs associated with the disruption of campus operations due to the Coronavirus and this purchase has been identified as a cost that is reimbursable under such funding, and

- WHEREAS, on May 24, 2022, the Board of Trustees awarded a contract to Scantron Corporation, Eagan, MN for faculty evaluation annual software license renewal and maintenance for a total award not to exceed \$21,064, and
- **WHEREAS,** Scantron Corporation, Eagan, MN has provided a proposal for four (4) proprietary Opscan scanning systems, installation and two (2) years maintenance services at a cost not to exceed \$30,450, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and

- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union College of Union County, New Jersey award a contract to Scantron Corporation, Eagan, MN for scanning systems, installation, and maintenance services at a cost not to exceed \$30,450 for a total award not to exceed \$51,514 for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

On motion duly made by Mr. Betancourt, seconded by Mrs. Zimmermann and unanimously carried, the Board approved Resolutions F023-013 through F023-015 for adoption.

Resolution F023-016 - Spend \$17,500-\$37,500

- WHEREAS, there exists a need throughout the College for good or services, and
- **WHEREAS**, the attached purchases of goods and services are under the bid threshold of \$37,500, and
- **WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the individual contracts will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, the vendors provided information that exhibited compliance with the Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq or the contracts were arrived at through an open and fair process thereby releasing Union College of Union County, New Jersey from the requirement to obtain such documentation, and
- **WHEREAS,** The Vice President of Finance and Operations certifies that sufficient funds are available for the goods and services, and
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union College of Union County, New Jersey award contracts between \$17,500 and \$37,500 to the listed vendors for a total spend of \$79,879.

On motion duly made by Mr. Betancourt, seconded by Mrs. Zimmermann and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.

Resolution F023-017 - Surplus Disposal

- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A.18A:64A-25.27 provides for the disposal of surplus personal property no longer needed for College purposes, and
- **WHEREAS**, the College has determined that the attached list of items should be declared surplus, obsolete and unusable property (Exhibit I), and
- WHEREAS, the total fair value of the property (Exhibit I) is approximately \$100.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union College of Union County, New Jersey declares surplus, obsolete, unusable, and not needed for College purposes the property listed in Exhibit I, and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that College officials be authorized to dispose of the surplus, obsolete, unusable property listed in Exhibit I in accordance with the County College Contracts Law and the Union College of Union County, New Jersey Purchasing Policies.

On motion duly made by Mr. Betancourt, seconded by Mrs. Zimmermann and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.

Dr. Wilkin stated that the new budget is process and there will be no increase in tuition rates, and rates for out-of-county students will decrease from 100% to 80%.

- **WHEREAS**, the College has a need to replace the T-intersection fences on the Cranford and Plainfield Campuses, in support of the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.11a. provides for awarding contracts without public competitive bids when there is a participating cooperative pricing system pursuant to the laws of this state, and
- WHEREAS, on September 20, 2022, the Board of Trustees awarded a contract to Guardian Fence Co., Inc. Newark, NJ to remove and dispose the existing fencing and install new fence sections throughout the Cranford Campus in an amount not to exceed \$217,117, and
- WHEREAS, Guardian Fence Co., Inc. Newark, NJ has provided a proposal under Hunterdon County Educational Services Commission (HCESC) contract number Cat/Ser-19-16 to remove and dispose the existing chain link fencing and install a color coated chain link fences at the T-intersection-Cranford and Plainfield Campuses in an amount not to exceed \$8,337 and \$4,017 respectively, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, HCESC utilized competitive bidding for the award of contracts to Guardian Fence Co., Inc. Newark, NJ thereby releasing Union College of Union County, New Jersey from the requirement to obtain Pay-to-Play documentation, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union College of Union County, New Jersey ratify an award and award a contract to Guardian Fence Co., Inc. Newark, NJ to replace the T-intersection fences-Cranford and Plainfield campuses at a cost not to exceed \$8,337 and \$4,017 respectively for a total award of \$229,471 for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

On motion duly made by Mr. Katz, seconded by Mrs. Zimmermann and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption
