Dr. Segal stated there were no communications to report.

INSIDE THE COLLEGE

Dr. Lori Wilkin and Marlene Sousa presented the 2022-2023 budget proposal to the Board.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

Dr. McMenamin addressed the members of the Boards highlighting some of the events that have taken place at the College over the past month:

- On February 12, 2022, the Winter Commencement Ceremonies were held virtually and celebrated almost 800 students who completed their degrees and certificates.
- Dr. Hargrove, Vice President of Student Development, was named a Phi Theta Kappa Distinguished College Administrator.
- Board of Governors member and Cranford Police Chief Ryan Greco was elected President of the Union County Police Chiefs Association.
- Dr. McMenamin and Mary M. Zimmermann, Union County College Board of Governors Chair and Chair of the New Jersey Council of County Colleges, attended the Association of Community College Trustees 2022 National Legislative Summit in Washington, DC.
- Union County College held its opening ceremony for Black History Month on February 2, 2022 in the Richel Student Commons at the Cranford Campus. The theme was "A Different World: The Culture and Climate of the Black Experience."
- On February 9, 2022, the reveal of the 2022 "The Real Men of Union County College" calendar was held to bring awareness to the issue of domestic violence and was sponsored by the Dean of Students Office and the Foundation's Women 100 Project.
- Brianna Mills, a member of Union's women's basketball team was named Female Athlete of the Year by the Garden State Athletic Conference and the New Jersey Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women.
- Jordan Sievert, a Union theater student was recently accepted to the Summer Acting Program at Maggie Flanigan Studio in New York City.
- Dr. McMenamin met with Montclair President Jonathan Koppell to sign an agreement in which Montclair will offer degree programs at the University Center at Union's Scotch Plains campus.

Dr. McMenamin announced that last week we completed the next phase of the process to determine the top ten finalists of the 2023 Aspen Prize. She stated that we learned of several areas where we are in need of improvement but stated that the entire team at Union remains focused on excellence and that's what we are pursuing in our work and in our students' work. Dr. McMenamin said we are transforming our community one student at a time and the work of our board and the support we receive from our board are critical components to the nationally recognized success of Union County College. Dr. McMenamin stated that when the President and CEO of the Aspen Institute for Community College Excellence asked what is attributed to the dramatic improvement and success outcomes, she stated the support of our Board of Trustees and Board of Governors. She thanked everyone for their service to the College.

OPEN MEETING TO THE PUBLIC: PROPOSED FY2022-2023 BUDGET

Mr. Richel opened the meeting to the public only for the purpose of commenting on the proposed FY2022-2023 budget. No one addressed the Board. Mr. Richel then closed the meeting to the public.

AUDIT COMMITTEE

Mr. Connolly reported to the Board that at the Audit Committee meeting held earlier, Mr. Andy Lee, Principal at CliftonLarsonAllen stated that an audit of the College's financial statements, various Federal awards and State programs for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021 was performed, and an unmodified opinion was issued. Mr. Connolly also reported that Mr. Luke Winter, Manager at CliftonLarsonAllen stated that an audit of Credit Hour Enrollments was performed, and no deficiencies or weaknesses were noted

Mr. Connolly submitted the following Resolutions for approval:

Resolution A022-001 - Acceptance of FY 2021 Audit and Other Reports

- WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Union County College adopted a resolution on February 25, 2020 that appointed the audit firm of CliftonLarsonAllen LLP as its Independent Auditor, and
- WHEREAS, the audit firm of CliftonLarsonAllen LLP has completed (1) an audit of the College's basic financial statements as of, and for fiscal years ended June 30, 2021, including the Single Audit Schedules of Expenditures of Federal Awards, and State Financial Assistance for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021 with a Report on Internal Controls Over Financial Reporting and on Compliance and Other Matters prepared in conjunction with its audit and (2) an examination in accord with "agreed-upon procedures" applied to the College's reporting requirements for fundable credit hours for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021, and
- WHEREAS, all of its audits were conducted in accordance with Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; and in compliance with audit requirements as prescribed by the Department of Treasury, State of New Jersey, and its examination of "agreed-upon procedures" was conducted to procedures developed by the Council of County Colleges for use by the Department of Treasury;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union County College accepts CliftonLarsonAllen LLP Independent Auditor's Report of Union County College basic financial statements as of, and for the fiscal years ended, June 30, 2021, the Single Audit Schedules of Expenditures of Federal Awards, and State Financial Assistance for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021, the Report on Internal Control over Financial Reporting and On Compliance and Other Matters prepared in conjunction with its audit, and the Report on Applying Agreed Upon Procedures to the College's fundable credit hours for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021.

On motion duly made by Mr. Connolly, seconded by Mr. Castro and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.

Resolution A022-002 - Additional Fees of Independent Auditor

WHEREAS, the need exists for a College-wide Independent Auditor, and

- **WHEREAS**, the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a.(15) provides for awarding of contracts for professional consulting services without public competitive bids, and
- WHEREAS, on February 25, 2020, after a fair and open process, the Board of Trustees of Union County College awarded a contract to CliftonLarsonAllen LLP, Plymouth Meeting, PA to provide independent auditing services in the amount of \$117,000 for two years, with \$59,000 allotted for the audit ending Fiscal Year 2021, and
- **WHEREAS,** as a result of professional services related to CARES act single audit testing and consultations around the Higher Educational Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) in connection with the audit for the year ended June 30, 2021, additional funding is needed in the amount of \$8,400, and
- WHEREAS, the College has received Federal and State grant awards to cover costs associated with the disruption of campus operations due to the Coronavirus and this purchase has been identified as a cost that is reimbursable under such funding, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union County College ratify an award to CliftonLarsonAllen LLP, Plymouth Meeting, PA for additional audit fees related to Coronavirus audit testing and consultations at a cost of \$8,400 for a total FY 2021contract award not to exceed \$67,400 for the audit ending Fiscal Year 2021.

On motion duly made by Mr. Connolly, seconded by Mr. Castro and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.

Resolution A022-003 - Appointment of Independent Auditor

WHEREAS, the need exists for a college-wide Independent Auditor, and

- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a.(1) provides an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids for professional services, and
- WHEREAS, CliftonLarsonAllen LLP, Plymouth Meeting, PA submitted a proposal to provide independent auditing services of the College's Financial Statements, including Schedules of Expenditures of Federal Awards, and State Financial Assistance, conducted in accordance with Government Auditing Standards issued by the Comptroller General of the United States and in compliance with audit requirements as prescribed by the Department of Treasury, State of New Jersey; performing "agreed-upon procedures," developed by the New Jersey Council of County Colleges for use by the New Jersey Department of Treasury, upon the reporting requirements for fundable credit hours; and preparing a report on internal controls over financial reporting and such other matter as may be necessary for Fiscal Years 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 at \$63,000 for each Fiscal Year, and
- **WHEREAS**, the fee for independent auditor services by CliftonLarsonAllen LLP, Plymouth Meeting, PA was \$59,000 for Fiscal Year 2020-2021, and
- WHEREAS, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay to Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, CliftonLarsonAllen LLP, Plymouth Meeting, PA has completed and submitted Business Entity Disclosure and Political Contribution Disclosure Certifications, certifying that they have not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the one year before their contract award, and they will be prohibited from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union County College award a contract to CliftonLarsonAllen LLP, Plymouth Meeting, PA to provide independent auditing services for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 and Fiscal Year 2022-2023 for a total contract award of \$126,000.

On motion duly made by Mr. Connolly, seconded by Mr. Castro and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.

EDUCATIONAL PLANNING AND POLICY COMMITTEE

Mrs. Zimmermann reported to the Board that at the Educational Planning and Policy meeting held earlier that Dr. Polnariev noted the inclusion in the packet of the five-year Administrative Services Plan which highlighted the following areas: Assessment, Planning & Research; College Relations; Communication Center; Continuing Education & Workforce Development; Scotch Plains Campus. Mrs. Zimmermann also stated that twelve Bloomberg terminals have been integrated into business management and business marketing courses at Union County College. She stated that access to systems that allow students accesses to real-time global financial, and economic data, and business news feeds used by investors enhances the educational experience for business students. Mrs. Zimmermann reported that as of February 7, 2022, enrollment for Spring is -.8%

- WHEREAS, Addendum of Agreement between Union County College, Union County, New Jersey and Saint Peter's University, Hudson County, New Jersey, amends and is hereby incorporated into the existing Agreement between Union County College, Union County, New Jersey and Saint Peter's University, Hudson County, New Jersey (Exhibit 1), and
- WHEREAS, Addendum of Agreement expands program offerings and admissions opportunities to Saint Peter's University, New Jersey, specifically in support of Union County College's University Center at the Scotch Plains Campus, New Jersey (Exhibit 1), and
- **WHEREAS,** the parties have identified the B.S. Health Sciences undergraduate program at Saint Peter's University will be subject to this Agreement (Exhibit 1), and
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union County College, New Jersey approves the Addendum of Agreement between Union County College, New Jersey and Saint Peter's University, Hudson County, New Jersey, and

Resolution E022-009 - Memorandum of Agreement with Queen City Academy Charter School

- WHEREAS, a Memorandum of Agreement has been reached between Union County College, Cranford, New Jersey and Queen City Academy Charter School, Plainfield, New Jersey to facilitate an Early College Program designed to create new pathways to college degree attainment; and
- WHEREAS, the Early College Program is intended to provide entry into higher education for academically prepared students at Queen City Academy Charter School, Plainfield, New Jersey, beginning in the 9th grade affording them the opportunity to concurrently earn an Associate of Science degree while also achieving their high school diploma; and
- WHEREAS, the Early College Program curriculum was jointly designed to concurrently satisfy requirements of the Queen City Academy Charter School diploma and the Union County College Associate of Science degree in Computer Information Systems or Engineering in a four-year time period; and
- **WHEREAS,** the first two years of the Early College Program will be delivered at Queen City Academy Charter School and the last two years will be delivered at Union County College; and
- **WHEREAS,** Union County College and Queen City Academy Charter School will provide select essential academic services for their respective courses throughout the four years of the program and establish a joint advisory body to manage program operations; and
- **WHEREAS,** Union County College and Queen City Academy Charter School will establish a joint advisory body consisting of representatives from academic affairs and student development to manage administrative operations of the Early College Program; and
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union County College, Cranford, New Jersey, approves the Memorandum of Agreement between Union County College, Cranford, New Jersey, and Queen City Academy Charter School, Plainfield, New Jersey (Exhibit 2), and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that College officials be authorized to approve the Memorandum of Agreement between Union County College, Cranford, New Jersey, and Queen City Academy Charter School, Plainfield, New Jersey.

Resolution E022-010 - Memorandum of Agreement with Montclair State University

- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union County College, New Jersey, approves the Memorandum of Agreement between Union County College, New Jersey, and Montclair State University, New Jersey (Exhibit 3), and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that College officials be authorized to approve the Memorandum of Agreement between Union County College, New Jersey, and Montclair State University, New Jersey.

On motion duly made by Mrs. Zimmermann, seconded by Mr. Castro and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.

SAFETY REPORT

Dr. McMenamin stated that in compliance with N.J.S.A. 18A:3B-71 requiring reporting of campus crimes and fire incidents for the period from January 5, 2022 through February 4, 2022, Public Safety advised that there were no incidents to report.

BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

Mr. Connolly reviewed the Investment Report and reported that all investments were found to be in order and are within acceptable norms.

Financial Report:

Mr. Connolly reviewed the Financial Report and stated revenue is down approximately 2.9% due to enrollment decrease. He reported that the College has experienced an increase in State funding of \$1.5 million due to appropriations returning to normal funding levels, and the net increase in other income is directly related to parking fees and the return to campus. Mr. Bashe stated that the net decrease in total expenses year over year is a result of reduction in personnel offset by an increase in other expenses related to the return to campus.

Current Estimate Report:

Mr. Connolly reviewed the Current Estimate Report and stated that at this time, a transfer to Unrestricted Net Position of \$5.0 million is anticipated for fiscal year ended June 30, 2022.

Resolution F022-034 - FY 2022-2023 Budget Adoption

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Union County College is required to prepare and deliver to each member of the Union County College Board of School Estimate "an

- itemized statement of the amount of money estimated to be necessary for the operations and capital outlay expenditures for the ensuing year", and
- **WHEREAS,** under the terms of the Higher Education Restructuring Act, a public hearing for the Union County College community is being conducted "on the amount of money estimated to be necessary for the operations and capital outlay expenditures for the ensuing year";
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union County College adopts the budget for FY 2022-23 totaling \$71,240,562 based upon a 6,005 State of New Jersey fundable full-time equivalent student enrollment, and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Union County College Board of School Estimate be requested to certify to the Union County Board of County Commissioners that \$16,374,380 be appropriated for the operations of Union County College for the period from July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023, and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that a capital outlay budget for FY 2022-2023 totaling \$8,815,368 be adopted, and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Union County College Board of School Estimate be requested to certify to the Union County Board of County Commissioners that \$8,815,368 be appropriated for capital outlay expenditures of Union County College for FY 2022-2023, and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that a date, place, and time for the holding of a public hearing by the Union County College Board of School Estimate on the FY 2022-2023 budget be selected and appropriate public notice be given pursuant to the applicable statutes.

On motion duly made by Mr. Connolly, seconded by Mr. Castro and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.

Resolution F022-035 - FY 2022-2023 Tuition Rates and Fee Adoption

WHEREAS, Chapter 42, P.L.L 1982 authorizes the Board of Trustees to "fix and determine tuition rates and other fees to be paid by students", and

WHEREAS, the following tuition rates and fee changes are reflected in the proposed budget for FY 2022-2023,

- WHEREAS, there is a need for professional consulting services to expand the usage of advanced features and integration of the entire non-credit curriculum into Elevate, a platform within Colleague Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system for continuing education platform to supply online registration, cost tracking and communication services, in support of the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS**, the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a(19) provides for an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids in the provision of goods or services for the use, support or maintenance of proprietary computer hardware, software peripherals and system development for the hardware, and
- **WHEREAS,** County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a(15) provides for awarding of contracts for professional consulting services without public competitive bids, and
- **WHEREAS,** Ellucian Company L.P., Reston, VA is Union County College's current in-house provider of Colleague, the administrative software for the College's ERP system, including financial reporting, financial aid, grant management and human resources, which has been utilized since January 2009, and
- WHEREAS, on December 7, 2021, the Board of Trustees approved an award to Ellucian Company L.P., Reston, VA for technology management support services from September 20, 2022, through September 30, 2027, for an amount not to exceed \$15,420,979, and
- WHEREAS, Ellucian Company L.P., Reston, VA has submitted a proposal to provide consulting services for Elevate for a one (1) year period from March 1, 2022 through February 28, 2023 at a total cost not to exceed \$60,000, and
- WHEREAS, the College has received Federal and State grant awards to cover costs associated with the disruption of campus operations due to the Coronavirus and the purchase above has been identified as a cost that is reimbursable under such funding, and

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- **WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS,** the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and

- WHEREAS, on December 4, 2018, the Board of Trustees of Union County College awarded a contract to Cablevision Lightpath LLC, Long Island City, NY for \$170,136 from December 2018 through December 2021 for voice communication services, and
- WHEREAS, on May 25, 2021, the Board of Trustees of Union County College awarded a contract to Cablevision Lightpath LLC, Long Island City, NY for \$72,000 for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 for the annual Dark Fiber Lease, and
- WHEREAS, Cablevision Lightpath LLC, Long Island City, NY has provided additional voice communications services to date in the sum of \$11,606 for Fiscal Year 2021-2022, which was under the threshold of \$37,500 for publicly bid services and did not require Board of Trustee approval, and
- WHEREAS, Cablevision Lightpath LLC, Long Island City, NY, an authorized vendor of the Educational Services Commission of New Jersey (ESCNJ) under contract ESCNJ #19/20-30, has submitted a five (5) month proposal for a total of \$27,000, at a monthly cost of \$5,400, from February 2022 through June 2022 to provide voice communication services in conjunction with the Cisco VoIP phone systems that support all campuses, and
- WHEREAS, Cablevision Lightpath LLC, Long Island City, NY, an authorized vendor of ESCNJ under contract ESCNJ #19/20-30, has further submitted a five (5) year proposal beginning July 2022 and extending through June 2027 for a total of \$330,000, at a monthly cost of \$5,500, to provide voice communication services in conjunction with the Cisco VoIP phone systems that support all campuses, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, ESCNJ utilized competitive bidding for the award of the contracts to Cablevision Lightpath LLC, Long Island City, and the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq., provides that contracts arrived at through an open and fair process are exempt from the Pay-to-Play Law, thereby releasing Union County College from the requirement to obtain such documentation, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;

- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union County College award a contract to Cablevision Lightpath LLC, Long Island City, NY in an amount not to exceed \$27,000 for the period from February 2022 through June 2022, for a total award not to exceed \$280,742 for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 to provide enterprise voice services in conjunction with the new Cisco VoIP phone line system for the Cranford and Elizabeth campuses that supports all campuses.

- **WHEREAS,** there is a need to install new enhanced UPS Battery Backup units to support network infrastructure upgrades on all campuses and for a renewal of cybersecurity software in support of the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS**, the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A.18A:64A-25.5.a.(19) provides for an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids in the provision of goods or services for the use, support or maintenance of proprietary computer hardware, software peripherals and system development for the hardware, and
- **WHEREAS**, the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A.18A:64A-25.11a.(b) provides for awarding contracts without public competitive bids when there is a nationally recognized and accepted cooperative agreement that has been publicly bid for the product or service, and
- **WHEREAS,** the College has received Federal and State grant awards to cover costs associated with the disruption of campus operations due to the Coronavirus and this purchase has been identified as a cost that is reimbursable under such funding, and
- WHEREAS, on May 25, 2021, the Board of Trustees awarded a contract to Aspire Technology Partners, LLC, Eatontown, NJ to provide voice and data, software maintenance renewal and support for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 for a total cost not to exceed \$323,815, and
- WHEREAS, on June 22, 2021, the Board of Trustees awarded a contract to Aspire Technology Partners, LLC, Eatontown, NJ to provide specialized hardware, installation, licensing, and support for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 for sixty (60) video-enabled

classrooms and public spaces, including but not limited to the Roy Smith Theater and the Richel Commons, and to provide fifty (50) licenses over a five-year (5) period for software that will automate call history from the VoIP system, for a total cost not to exceed \$2,604,134, and

- WHEREAS, on September 21, 2021, the Board of Trustees awarded a contract to Aspire Technology Partners, LLC, Eatontown, NJ to provide core network infrastructure upgrades and an additional sixty (60) video-enabled classrooms and support for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 for a total cost not to exceed \$5,821,244, and
- WHEREAS, on December 7, 2021, the Board of Trustees awarded a contract to Aspire Technology Partners, LLC, Eatontown, NJ to provide wi-fi access points installation on all campuses and support for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 for a total cost not to exceed \$147,700, and
- WHEREAS, on January 25, 2022, the Board of Trustees awarded a contract to Aspire Technology Partners, LLC, Eatontown, NJ to provide cloud managed smart security cameras on all campuses and UPS battery back-up to support network infrastructure upgrades for \$2,000,000 and \$383,660 for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 for a total cost not to exceed \$2,383,660, and
- WHEREAS, Aspire Technology Partners, LLC, Eatontown, NJ has submitted a proposal under National Cooperative Purchasing Alliance (NCPA) contract #01-97 to provide professional services for removal and disposal of old units and installation of new enhanced UPS battery back-ups to support network infrastructure upgrades at a cost not to exceed \$50,356, and
- WHEREAS, Aspire Technology Partners, LLC, Eatontown, NJ has also submitted a proposal under NCPA contract #01-86 for continued provision of OKTA software as the College's Single Sign On (SSO) and Multi Factor Authentication (MFA) tool which authenticates logins creating a more secure environment while also offering ease of accessing resources and allows for self-service password reset functionality at a cost not to exceed \$84,224 for the period from March 14, 2022 until March 13, 2023, and
- **WHEREAS**, the cost for the same cybersecurity software renewal was \$81,360 for Fiscal Year 2020-2021, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and

- WHEREAS, NCPA utilized competitive bidding for the award of the contracts to Aspire Technology Partners, LLC, Eatontown, NJ, and the New Jersey Local Unit Payto-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq., provides that contracts arrived at through an open and fair process are exempt from the Play-to-Play law, thereby releasing Union County College from the requirement to obtain such documentation, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union County College award contracts to Aspire Technology Partners, LLC, Eatontown, NJ for the removal and disposal of old units and installation of new enhanced UPS battery back-ups to support network infrastructure and Cybersecurity software renewal at a cost not to exceed \$50,356 and \$84,224 respectively, for a total award not to exceed \$11,415,133 for Fiscal Year 2021-2022.

On motion duly made by Mr. Connolly, seconded by Mr. Castro and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.

Mr. Katz submitted the following Resolution for approval:

<u>Resolution B022-002 - Authorization for Certification for the Cranford Campus Physical</u> Education Facility Renovation

- WHEREAS, on January 28, 2021, Union County College (the "College") responded to a request from New Jersey Council of County Colleges ("NJCCC") by submitting a preliminary request for capital funding under N.J.S.A. 18A:72A-12.4. County College Capital Projects Funding ("Chapter 12"), and
- **WHEREAS,** NJCCC has advised the College of its recommendation to the State Treasurer that preliminarily would make available \$4.264 million to the College under Chapter 12 funding, and

- **WHEREAS**, the funds will be used to renovate the physical education facility on the Cranford campus, and
- WHEREAS, the total cost of the project is estimated to be \$20 million, and
- WHEREAS, on February 25, 2020, the Union County College Board of Trustees authorized renovations to the Cranford Campus Physical Education Facility Renovation and certified an amount of money for such purpose as \$5.580 million to be provided under the provisions of the fiscal year 2021 Chapter 12 funding, and
- WHEREAS, on February 23, 2021, the Union County College Board of Trustees authorized renovations to the Cranford Campus Physical Education Facility Renovation and certified an amount of money for such purpose as \$5.578 million to be provided under the provisions of the fiscal year 2021 Chapter 12 funding, and
- **WHEREAS,** Union County College has an interest in pursuing funds that may be available under the provisions of Chapter 12 for financial assistance in connection with this project and accordingly has included it in its preliminary request to the NJCCC for fiscal year 2023 Chapter 12 funding, and
- **WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-19, the Union County College Board of Trustees is to deliver to the Union County College Board of School Estimate (the "Board of School Estimate") an estimate of its cost of the project and the amount of money needed for the project;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union County College hereby determines a) the need for the College to expend \$20 million for a renovated physical education facility on the Cranford campus, and b) the estimated cost of this construction is \$20 million, c) the amount of money needed for such purpose by the Board of Trustees of the College is \$20 million, and d) the College will pursue Chapter 12 State funding for all or a portion of said purpose.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that The Board of School Estimate is hereby requested to certify to the Union County Board of County Commissioners that \$4.264 million be raised through the issuance of County College bonds and notes by the County of Union to fund the renovated physical education facility on the Cranford campus.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that a copy of this resolution shall be delivered to each member of the Union County College Board of School Estimate.

On motion duly made by Mr. Castro, seconded by Mr. Connolly and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.
