SAFETY REPORT

Dr. McMenamin stated that in compliance with N.J.S.A. 18A:3B-71 requiring reporting of campus crimes and fire incidents for the period from April 1, 2022 to May 5, 2022, Public Safety advised that there were no incidents to report.

BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

Mr. Connolly reviewed the Investment Report and reported that all investments are found to be in order and are within acceptable norms.

Financial Report:

Mr. Connolly reviewed the Financial Report and stated revenue is down approximately 3.2% due to enrollment decrease. He reported that the College has experienced an increase in State funding of \$1.5 million due to appropriations returning to normal funding levels, and the net increase in other income is directly related to parking fees and the return to campus. Mr. Connolly stated that the net decrease in total expenses year over year is a result of reduction in personnel offset by an increase in other expenses related to the return to campus.

Current Estimate Report:

Mr. Connolly reviewed the Current Estimate Report and stated that at this time, a transfer to Unrestricted Net Position of \$4.9 million is anticipated for fiscal year ended June 30, 2022.

Resolution F022-059 - New Jersey Career Accelerator Internship Grant Program (CAIGP)

- **WHEREAS,** Union County College, as a comprehensive community college, seeks to provide career programs designed to assist students and other Union County residents to become employed, and

- WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey, Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE), will provide funding through the New Jersey Career Accelerator Internship Grant Program (CAIGP) to: (1) direct costs for career fairs, including the waiver of registration fees for employers to attend Grantee's career fairs, (2) career technology tools/platforms that facilitate connections between undergraduate students and internship opportunities (i.e., Handshake, Symplicity, GradLeaders, and 12twenty), (3) networking events that connect undergraduate students with employers with the purpose of assisting students in identifying and securing internships, and (4) costs associated with the creation of marketing materials focused on recruiting students and employers for internship opportunities, and
- WHEREAS, Union County College received notification that it was awarded funding in the amount of \$13,613 from the State of New Jersey, Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE) for the New Jersey Career Accelerator Internship Grant Program (CAIGP) for the period April 4, 2022 through August 31, 2022;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union County College accepts the funding of \$13,613 from the State of New Jersey, Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE) for the New Jersey Career Accelerator Internship Grant Program (CAIGP) for the period April 4, 2022 through August 31, 2022.

- **WHEREAS**, the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.11.a.b. provides for awarding contracts without public competitive bids when there is a nationally recognized and accepted cooperative agreement that has been publicly bid for the product or service, and
- WHEREAS, Home Depot U.S.A., Inc. Dba The Home Depot Pro, Atlanta, GA has submitted a proposal under OMNIA contract #17-21 to provide janitorial supplies, not including any COVID 19 emergent supplies, at a cost not to exceed \$100,000 for Fiscal Year 2022-2023, and

- **WHEREAS,** Home Depot U.S.A., Inc. Dba The Home Depot Pro, Atlanta, GA has submitted another proposal under OMNIA contract #16154 to provide building supplies, at a cost not to exceed \$30,000 for Fiscal Year 2022-2023, and
- **WHEREAS**, the cost for janitorial supplies for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 is projected to be \$83,597 with this figure not including any COVID 19 emergent supplies, and
- **WHEREAS,** the cost for building supplies for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 is projected to be \$28,800, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. etseq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and

Dba The Home Depot Pro, Atlanta, GA for janitorial supplies, not including any COVID 19 emergent supplies, in the amount of \$100,000 and for building supplies in the amount of \$30,000 for a total award not to exceed \$130,000 for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

- **WHEREAS,** the spend for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 with W.B. Mason Co. Inc., Brockton, MA is projected to be \$37,000 and

- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS,** the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and

- WHEREAS, the College expended no funds for toner cartridge supplies for Fiscal Year 2021-2022, which is reflective of increased reliance on electronic resources, efficacious print management policies, consolidation of printers through-out the college, and having inventory on hand to supply the current fleet of printers for most of the year, and
- **WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and

- **WHEREAS**, the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.28.(d) provides for exceptions to the requirement for advertising for bids for the provision of goods or services for the use, support or maintenance of proprietary computer hardware, software peripherals and system development for the hardware not more than five (5) years, and
- **WHEREAS,** the College has received Federal and State grant awards to cover costs associated with the disruption of campus operations due to the Coronavirus and this purchase has been identified as a cost that is reimbursable under such funding, and
- WHEREAS, SHI International Corp, Somerset, NJ an authorized NJ State Contract Vendor and distributor for NJEdge.Net, Inc contract no. 269EMCPS-21-001-EM-SHI has submitted a proposal to provide a complete one card access system at a cost not to exceed \$2,498,148 to include the following items/modules for five (5) years from June 1, 2022-May 31, 2027,

Attendance Modules
All Upgrade Modules Required for Encoding

- WHEREAS, on June 22, 2021, the Board of Trustees awarded a contract to SHI International Corp, Somerset, NJ an authorized NJ State Contract vendor and distributor for OMNIA Partners for virtual desktop software licenses, maintenance, and support for a cost not to exceed \$458,371, and
- WHEREAS, on September 21, 2021, the Board of Trustees awarded a contract to SHI International Corp, Somerset, NJ an authorized NJ State Contract vendor and distributor for OMNIA partners for virtual desktop software licensing and ID card printers at a cost not to exceed \$172,513, and
- WHEREAS, on November 9, 2021, the Board of Trustees awarded a contract to SHI International Corp, Somerset, NJ an authorized NJ State Contract Vendor for server upgrades for the Elizabeth Campus and for vaccine tracking software at a cost not to exceed \$34,738, and
- WHEREAS, on December 7, 2021, the Board of Trustees awarded a contract to SHI International Corp, Somerset, NJ an authorized NJ State contract vendor for Rubrik network data management services system at a cost not to exceed \$15,000, and
- WHEREAS, on April 19, 2022, the Board of Trustees awarded a contract to SHI International Corp, Somerset, NJ an authorized NJ State contract vendor for router replacement for the Kellogg Building on the Elizabeth Campus and for hardware, software and HP color printer for the Cranford campus Innovation Center at a cost not to exceed \$67,480, and
- **WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and

- WHEREAS, NJ State Contract vendors are subject to the Pay-to-Play Law and are required to maintain Business Entity Disclosure and Political Contribution Disclosure Certifications with the State of New Jersey to maintain their position as a state contract vendor, thereby releasing Union County College from the requirement to obtain such documentation, and
- WHEREAS, NJEdge.Net, Inc utilized competitive bidding for the awards of their contracts to SHI International Corp, Somerset, NJ and thereby releasing Union County College from the requirement to obtain Pay-to-Play documentation, and
- **WHEREAS**, a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union County College award a contract to SHI International Corp, Somerset, NJ for one card access system for a cost not to exceed \$2,498,148 for a total award of \$3,246,250 for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

On motion duly made by Mr. Connolly, seconded by Mr. Betancourt and unanimously carried, the Board approved Resolutions F022-076 through F022-078 for adoption.

Dr. Wilkin reported the College is continuing to review the self-insured health insurance program to ensure that this program is in our best economic interest.

Mr. Katz presented the following Resolution for approval:

Resolution B022-004 - Parking Lot Repair-Cranford

- **WHEREAS**, the College has the need to repair the asphalt surface and fill potholes in Parking Lot 2 at the Cranford campus, in support of the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS,** requests for pricing was submitted to three (3) vendors with two declining to quote, and

- WHEREAS, Crossroads Pavement Maintenance LLC, Pompton Plains, NJ has submitted the only proposal to repair the asphalt surface and fill potholes in Parking Lot 2 at the Cranford campus for a total amount not to exceed \$37,000, which is below the bid threshold amount, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, Crossroad Pavement Maintenance LLC, Pompton Plains, NJ has completed and submitted Business Entity Disclosure and Political Contribution Disclosure Certification, that certify that they have not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the one year before the contract award, and they will be prohibited from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract, and
- **WHEREAS**, a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union County College ratify an award to Crossroads Pavement Maintenance LLC, Pompton Plains, NJ for repair of the asphalt surface and to fill potholes in Parking Lot 2 at the Cranford campus at a cost not to exceed \$37,000.

On motion duly made by Mrs. Zimmermann, seconded by Mr. Connolly and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.

The following Resolution was adopted at the Joint Board Meeting prior to the Board of Trustees Meeting and was introduced by Mr. Richel for approval by the Trustees:

Resolution C022-001 - College Name Change

- **WHEREAS,** the Board of Trustees and Board of Governors of Union County College have determined that it is in the best interest of the College and in support of the mission of the College to change the College's name; and
- **WHEREAS**, the College has changed its name several times over its almost 90-year existence; and
- WHEREAS, Union County Junior College opened on October 16, 1933 founded by U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt as an "emergency junior college" through the federal Works Project Administration with the original mission of providing jobs for unemployed teachers and professors; and

- **WHEREAS**, the College was then known as Union Junior College, a private two-year institution of higher education, incorporated on March 25, 1943 and governed by a Board of Trustees. Its name was changed to Union College on July 25, 1967; and
- **WHEREAS,** in 1982, Union College was consolidated with Union County Technical Institute pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-50 et seq. and became Union County College, the public community college of the County of Union; and
- WHEREAS, the Board of Governors of Union County College is the successor to and a continuation of the Board of Trustees of Union College. The governance, control, conduct management and administration of Union County College is "vested in and allocated between the Board of Trustees and Board of Governors" pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-56; and
- WHEREAS a name change is an opportunity to rebrand the College in alignment with recent accolades such as being twice consecutively named an Aspen Prize Top 150 Community College and being recognized as a 2023 Aspen Prize semifinalist; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Board of Trustees and Board of Governors has determined that it is in the best interest of the College to change the College name to "Union College of Union County, New Jersey"; and
- **WHEREAS**, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 18A:64A-12(a), the Board of Trustees is granted the power "[t]o adopt or change the name of the county college;" and
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the joint Boards of Trustees and Governors of Union County College, New Jersey approve that the new name of the College shall be "Union College of Union County, New Jersey" effective as of July 1, 2022.
- **AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the President is authorized to take such actions as are appropriate to effectuate the name change.

On motion duly made by Mr. Betancourt, seconded by Mr. Figueredo and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.
