REPORTS OF JOINT TRUSTEES AND GOVERNORS' COMMITTEES

AUDIT COMMITTEE

Mr. Horan reported that at the Audit Committee meeting held earlier today, PKF O'Connor Davies stated that two audits were performed: Business Process Reviews and Discussion of Remediation Testing. Mr. Horan reported that the audit resulted in two open items: Student Account Passwords and Sensitive Data Inscription, both of which will be remedied by IT.

Mr. Horan submitted the following Resolutions for approval:

Resolution A021-002 - Acceptance of FY2022 Audit Plan

- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5 (a) (15) provides for awarding of contracts for professional consulting services without public competitive bids, and
- WHEREAS, PKF O'Connor Davies of New York, NY has recommended five audit areas for review during FY 2021-2022 which are 1) executive compensation and benefits, 2) financial aid compliance, 3) business continuity and disaster recovery, 4) Perkins grant compliance, and 5) physical inventory of grant specific assets for a cost not to exceed \$37,050, and
- **WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay to Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq. provides that the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceed \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay to Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer has determined that the total contract will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, the award of the contract to PKF O'Connor Davies of New York, NY is subject to the College's receipt of properly executed Business Entity Disclosure and Political Contribution Disclosure Certifications, certifying that they have not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the one year previous to their contract award, and will be prohibited from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union County College award a contract to PKF O'Connor Davies, New York, NY to perform various internal audit services as previously described for a total cost not to exceed \$37,050 for work to be performed during fiscal year 2021-2022.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union County College award a contract to PKF O'Connor Davies, New York, NY subject to the College's receipt of properly executed Pay to Play documentation certifying that they have not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.26 that would statutorily prohibit issuance of a purchase order or agreement execution.

On motion duly made by Mr. Betancourt, seconded by Mr. Castro and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.

Resolution A021-003 - Additional Fees of Independent Auditor

WHEREAS, the need exists for a College-wide Independent Auditor, and

- **WHEREAS**, the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a.(15) provides for awarding of contracts for professional consulting services without public competitive bids, and
- WHEREAS, on February 25, 2020, after a fair and open process, the Board of Trustees of Union County College awarded a contract to CliftonLarsonAllen LLP, Plymouth Meeting, PA to provide independent auditing services in the amount of \$117,000 for two years, with \$58,000 allotted for the audit ending Fiscal Year 2020, and
- **WHEREAS,** as a result of professional services related to CARES act single audit testing and consultations around the Higher Educational Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) in connection with the audit for the year ended June 30, 2020, additional funding is needed in the amount of \$19,005, and
- **WHEREAS,** the College has received Federal and State grant awards to cover costs associated with the disruption of campus operations due to the Coronavirus and this purchase has been identified as a cost that is reimbursable under such funding, and
- WHEREAS, the College also has a need for CliftonLarsonAllen LLP, Plymouth Meeting, PA, as an independent audit firm, to perform tax services for required filings related to employer provided health coverage for its employees. Previously, \$6,300 was disclosed on the March report of authorized payments in excess of original award presented to the Board. This did not require Board action. An additional \$2,060 was deemed necessary for the filing of the ACA forms for calendar year 2020, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union County College ratifies an award to CliftonLarsonAllen LLP, Plymouth Meeting, PA for additional audit fees related to Coronavirus audit testing and consultations at a cost of \$19,005 and \$2,060 for tax services for a total FY 2021contract award not to exceed \$85,365 for the audit ending Fiscal Year 2020 and tax services for tax year 2020.

On motion duly made by Mr. Betancourt, seconded by Mr. Castro and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.

EDUCATIONAL PLANNING AND POLICY COMMITTEE

Mrs. Zimmermann reported to the Board that at the Educational Planning and Policy meeting held earlier that Dr. Lown reported on ACUE's mission which is to ensure student success through quality instruction that facilitate retention and graduation and also to address equity in

the classroom. She showed a short video where faculty and staff shared their perceptions of the value of this experience. She also stated that Dr. Cooner presented programs reviewed in Fall 2020 as well as their job outlooks and recommendations. The programs reviewed were: Automotive Technology; Business Fundamentals; English; Media; Paramedic Emergency Health Science; Radiography. Mrs. Zimmermann reported that as of May 25, 2021, enrollment for Summer I is +6.6% and enrollment for Summer II is +16%.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union County College, New Jersey approves the Articulation Agreement between Union County College, New Jersey and Southern New Hampshire University - College of Online and Continuing Education, Manchester, NH (Exhibit 1), and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that College officials be authorized to approve the Articulation Agreement between Union County College, New Jersey and Southern New Hampshire University - College of Online and Continuing Education, Manchester, NH (Exhibit 1).

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On motion duly made by Mrs. Zimmermann, seconded by Mr. Betancourt and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.

SAFETY REPORT – S485

Dr. McMenamin stated that in compliance with the Cunningham – Ruiz Law (S485, codified at N.J.S.A. 18:3B-71) requiring reporting of campus crimes and fire incidents for the period from April 6, 2021 to May 6, 2021, Public Safety advised that there were no incidents to report.

BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

Mr. Bashe reviewed the Investment Report and reported that all investments are found to be in order and are within acceptable norms.

Financial Report:

Mr. Bashe reviewed the financial report for March 31, 2021, and stated revenue is down approximately 6.89% resulting from a year to date 7.49% enrollment decrease which has been a direct result of the pandemic. He reported that the College has also experienced a decrease in State funding of \$1.4 million compared to the previous year due to budget cuts, and that the decrease in total expenses year over year is primarily due to the College's efforts to control costs in this COVID environment. Mr. Bashe reported that overall positions have been reduced by retirements, many vacancies have not been replaced, positions have been eliminated and part-time positions have been drastically reduced throughout the College.

Current Estimate Report:

Mr. Bashe reviewed the Current Estimate Report and stated that at this time, a transfer to Unrestricted Net Position of \$6.2 million is anticipated for fiscal year ended June 30, 2021.

Resolution F021-058 – Toner Cartridge Supplies

WHEREAS, the College has a need for toner cartridge supplies that are necessary for administrative and operational support functions, in support of the mission of the College, and

WHEREAS, the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.9. a. provides an exception to the requirement for advertising for bids when there is a State Contract for the product or service, and

- **WHEREAS,** funding is requested for \$45,000 for toner cartridges with ACCSES NJ Inc., Trenton, NJ, under State Contract #89072 for Fiscal Year 2021-2022, and
- **WHEREAS**, the cost for toner cartridge supplies for Fiscal Year 2020-2021 is projected to be \$4,000, which is reflective of the remote nature of operations for most of the year, and

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- **WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay to Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, NJ State Contract vendors are subject to the Pay-to-Play Law and are required to maintain Business Entity Disclosure and Political Contribution Disclosure Certifications with the State of New Jersey to maintain their position as a state contract vendor, thereby releasing Union County College from the requirement to obtain such documentation, and
- **WHEREAS**, a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union County College award a contract to ACCSES NJ Inc., Trenton, NJ at a cost not to exceed \$45,000 for toner cartridge supplies for Fiscal Year 2021-2022.

Resolution F021-059 - Janitorial Supplies and Building Materials

- **WHEREAS**, the College has a need for janitorial supplies including chemicals, paper and plastic goods and for building materials used in daily operations in support of the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.11a.b. provides for awarding contracts without public competitive bids when there is a nationally recognized and accepted cooperative agreement that has been publicly bid for the product or service, and
- WHEREAS, The Home Depot Pro, Atlanta, GA has submitted proposals under U.S. Communities contract #17-21 to provide janitorial supplies, not including any COVID 19 emergent supplies, at a cost not to exceed \$100,000 and under U.S. Communities contract #16154 to provide building materials at a cost not to exceed \$30,000 for a total cost not to exceed \$130,000 for Fiscal Year 2021-2022, and

- **WHEREAS**, the cost for janitorial supplies and building materials for Fiscal Year 2020-2021 is projected to be \$130,000 with this figure not including any COVID 19 emergent supplies, and
- **WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay to Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, U.S. Communities utilized competitive bidding for the award of the contract to The Home Depot Pro, Atlanta, GA thereby releasing Union County College from the requirement to obtain Pay-to-Play documentation, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union County College award a contract to The Home Depot Pro, Atlanta, GA for janitorial supplies, not including any COVID 19 emergent supplies, in the amount of \$100,000 and for building materials in the amount of \$30,000 for a total award not to exceed \$130,000 for Fiscal Year 2021-2022.

Resolution F021-060 - Metered Mail Service

- **WHEREAS**, postage metering for mailing of college materials is necessary to support ongoing operations and the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS**, the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.b. provides for awards without public competitive bids when made or entered into with the United States of America, the State of New Jersey, with a county or municipality or any board, body, or officer, agency or authority or any other state or subdivision thereof, and
- **WHEREAS,** United States Postal Service costs are anticipated to be \$80,000 for College mailings from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, consisting of College related materials and metered non-bulk postage, and
- WHEREAS, spending with the United States Postal Service metered mail postage for Fiscal Year 2021 was \$60,000 as a result of diminished usage during the COVID-19 pandemic crisis, and
- **WHEREAS,** the United States Postal Service is a government agency and is exempt from New Jersey Local Unit Pay to Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq., and

- **WHEREAS**, a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union County College approves a total amount not to exceed \$80,000 for metered mail service to be provided by the United States Postal Service from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022.

Resolution F021-061 - Nursing Instructional Equipment and Licensing

- **WHEREAS,** the College's Nursing Program has a need for virtual simulation equipment and licenses for virtual software programs to enhance students' knowledge and achieve objectives in the Nursing program in support of the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a.(3) provides for an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids for the purchase of items or services not available from more than one potential bidder, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a.(19) provides for an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids in the provision of goods or services for the use, support or maintenance of proprietary computer hardware, software peripherals and system development for the hardware, and
- WHEREAS, after a fair and open quote, with seven responses, Laerdal Medical Corporation, Wappingers Falls, NY submitted the lowest responsible quote for three (3) virtual nursing simulators, including student and instructor licenses, at a cost of \$25,316 and further submitted a proposal for proprietary licenses at a cost not to exceed \$7,837 for a total award not to exceed \$33,153 for the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. The virtual nursing mannequins and software simulates real nursing scenarios and helps nursing students develop clinical decision-making skills and competence, and
- WHEREAS, on June 26, 2020, the College submitted the final phase of its application for the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Improvement Grant ("Perkins") which was approved for the amount of \$738,261 on December 16, 2020 and accepted by the Board of Trustees on January 26, 2021, and
- WHEREAS, on March 23, 2021, the Board of Trustees approved revisions to needs of the College which resulted in reallocation of the approved budget among component line items of the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Improvement grant, which was approved by the Grantor on March 31, 2021, and
- **WHEREAS,** Laerdal had previously submitted Perkins proposals during the year totaling \$3,151, which was under the threshold amount that required Board of Trustee approval, and

- **WHEREAS,** the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer has determined that this purchase is within the stated purpose and goals of Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Improvement Grant, and
- **WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay to Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS,** the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer has determined that the value of the acquisition will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, Laerdal Medical Corporation, Wappingers Falls, NY has completed and submitted Business Entity Disclosure and Political Contribution Disclosure Certifications, certifying that they have not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the previous one year, and that they will be prohibited from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract, and
- **WHEREAS**, a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union County College ratify an award to Laerdal Medical Corporation, Wappingers Falls, NY to provide virtual nursing simulator mannequins and software licenses for students enrolled in the Nursing program at a cost not to exceed \$33,153 for a total cost not to exceed \$36,304 for the Fiscal Year 2020-2021.

On motion duly made by Mr. Bashe, seconded by Mr. Betancourt and unanimously carried, the Board approved Resolutions F021-058 through F021-061 for adoption.

<u>Resolution F021-062 - Broker and Risk Management Consultant and Administrative Services</u>

- WHEREAS, the College requires the services of an insurance broker and risk management consultant to provide broker and risk management consulting services including marketing and placement of insurance, provide policy administration, serve as a liaison between the College and insurance providers, provide assistance for special projects and to market and place additional lines of coverage, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a.(11) provides for an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids for insurance, including the purchase of insurance coverage and consulting services, and
- **WHEREAS,** Meeker Sharkey Associates LLC, Cranford, NJ has submitted a proposal to provide specified insurance broker and risk management consulting services for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 for a fee not to exceed \$43,000, and

- WHEREAS, Meeker Sharkey Associates LLC, Cranford, NJ has further submitted a proposal to provide brokerage services including consulting and administration for the College's group dental and vision insurance plans at a cost not to exceed \$15,000 for the Fiscal Year 2021-2022, and
- **WHEREAS,** the cost for similar services for Fiscal Year 2020-2021 was \$43,000 for insurance broker and risk management consulting services and \$15,000 for dental and vision insurance brokerage services, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay to Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, Meeker Sharkey Associates LLC, Cranford, NJ has completed and submitted Business Entity Disclosure and Political Contribution Disclosure Certifications, certifying that they have not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the one year previous to the contract award, and they will be prohibited from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union County College award a contract to Meeker Sharkey Associates LLC, Cranford, NJ for insurance broker and risk management consulting services for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 for a total cost not to exceed \$58,000.

Resolution F021-063 - Voice and Data Facility Services

- **WHEREAS,** network infrastructure technology is a necessary component of the technological environment and is essential to ongoing functionality in support of the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a.(19) provides for an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids in the provision of goods or services for the use, support or maintenance of proprietary computer hardware, software peripherals and system development for the hardware, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.28(d) provides for the provision of goods or services for the use, support or maintenance of proprietary computer hardware, software peripherals and system development for the hardware for any term not more than five (5) years, and

- WHEREAS, Iron Mountain Data Centers LLC, Boston, MA has submitted a five (5) year proposal to provide voice and data facility services for the period of June 1, 2021 through May 31, 2026 at a total cost of \$101,937, and
- **WHEREAS**, the cost for voice and data facility services for Fiscal Year 2020-2021 is projected to be \$19,045, and
- **WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay to Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and

- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Union County College award a change order to the contract award to Epic Mechanical, Neptune, NJ for a not to exceed amount of \$81,668 for purchase and installation of dedicated cooling units for data centers at Scotch Plains, for a total award not to exceed \$2,054,668.

- WHEREAS, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay to Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceed \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, the award of the contract to Triad Consulting Engineers, Morris Plains, NJ is subject to the College's receipt of properly executed Business Entity Disclosure and Political Contribution Disclosure Certifications, certifying that they have not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the one year previous to their contract award, and will be prohibited from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract, and
- **WHEREAS**, a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Financial Affairs and Treasurer;

- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union County College award a contract to Triad Consulting Engineers, Morris Plains, NJ for the engineering services for the electrical services upgrades for the Cranford campus at a total not to exceed award of \$387,000.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Union County College award a contract to Triad Consulting Engineers, Morris Plains, NJ subject to the College's receipt of properly executed Pay to Play documentation certifying that they have not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.26 that would statutorily prohibit issuance of a purchase order or agreement execution.
