SAFETY REPORT

Dr. McMenamin stated that in compliance with the Cunningham – Ruiz Law (S485, codified at N.J.S.A. 18a:3B-71) requiring reporting of campus crimes and fire incidents for the period of February 24, 2024 to April 12, 2024, Public Safety advised that there was a small fire that was intentionally set in an outside garbage can, and two separate incidents of theft of electric scooters from the rear parking lot of the Kellogg Building. All incidents were reported to the Elizabeth Police Department. There are no other incidents to report.

BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

Mr. Connolly stated that the Budget and Finance Committee met earlier and reviewed the Investment Report and reported that all investments are found to be in order and are within acceptable norms.

Financial Report:

Mr. Connolly reviewed the Financial Report and stated variances within the report are due to the following:

- Increase in enrollment impacted the student receivable balance, tuition revenue and the variable compensation for instruction.
- The net increase in expenses is primarily due to increases in full-time and variable compensation.

Current Estimate Report:

Mr. Connolly stated that also reviewed was the Current Estimate Report and reported that at this time, a transfer to Unrestricted Net Position of \$4.0 million is anticipated for fiscal year ended June 30, 2024.

Resolution F024-034 – Union County Funding for Food Insecurity

- WHEREAS, UCNJ Union College of Union County, New Jersey, as a comprehensive community college is committed to eliminating food insecurity within the College community to ensure the wellbeing of its students. The College has instituted a Food Insecurity Program which has multiple assistance sources in place to meet student's material needs, and actively seeks financial support from community organizations, individuals, corporations, foundations, and government sources for this effort, and
- WHEREAS, the County of Union, a Body Politic of the State of New Jersey is applying for funding as a recipient of State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLRF) established by the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) to help fund the College's Food Insecurity Program because the County has a reasonable basis for concluding that the College's Food Insecurity Program meets the criteria required for this funding, and
- WHEREAS, the County of Union desires to provide funding to the College under the terms of an MOU in the amount of \$250,000 for the period July 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024, for the College to use strictly for the Food Insecurity Program with a detailed accounting of how the funds are being used in connection with the Program, and
- **WHEREAS,** Social Workers at the College assess the needs of students with food insecurity and connect them with various community social service agencies, N.J. State

- assistance programs and help from the Food Insecurity Program at the College. Article I of the MOU "the grant" from the County of Union will provide the College with funding to further expand its Food Insecurity Program to ensure support for its students, and
- WHEREAS, the College received notification on March 14, 2024, that it was awarded the amount of \$250,000 under Article I of the MOU "the grant" for the College's Food Insecurity Program for the period July 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, New Jersey accepts \$250,000 from the County of Union to expand the College's Food Insecurity Program for the period July 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024.

- WHEREAS, VWR Funding, Inc Dba VWR International, LLC, Radnor, PA has submitted an additional proposal for biology laboratory supplies under the NJCC JPC bid #FY23 JPC-26 at a cost of \$9,292 for Fiscal Year 2023-2024, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, the vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and

- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, NJCC JPC utilized competitive bidding for the awards of contracts to VWR Funding, Inc Dba VWR International, LLC, Radnor, PA, thereby releasing UCNJ Union College of Union County, New Jersey from the requirement to obtain Payto-Play documentation, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, New Jersey award a contract for additional biology laboratory supplies at a cost not to exceed \$9,292 to VWR Funding, Inc Dba VWR International, LLC, Radnor, PA, for a total award not to exceed \$51,292 for Fiscal Year 2023-2024.
- Resolution F024-036 Dropout Detective Software Maintenance, Licensing and Support
- **WHEREAS**, the College has a need to identify students and instructors that may require additional support or services using student retention software, which is essential to student success, in support of the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a.(19) provides for exceptions to the requirement for advertising for bids for the provision of goods or services for the use, support or maintenance of proprietary computer hardware, software peripherals and system development for the hardware, and
- WHEREAS, AspirEDU, Inc, Anna Maria, FL has submitted a proposal at a cost not to exceed \$45,976 to provide annual maintenance, licensing and support for Dropout Detective software used to increase retention and graduation rates for students for Fiscal Year 2024-2025, and
- **WHEREAS,** the cost for the same software maintenance, licensing and support for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 was \$64,800, and
- **WHEREAS**, the reduction in cost is due to the removal of Instructure Insight platform for Fiscal 2024-2025, and
- WHEREAS, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- **WHEREAS,** AspirEDU, Inc., Anna Maria, FL has completed and submitted Business Entity Disclosure and Political Contribution Disclosure Certifications, certifying that

- they have not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the one year previous to their contract award, and they will be prohibited from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract, and

- WHEREAS, Johnson Controls US Holdings LLC Dba Johnson Controls Fire Protection LP, Milwaukee, WI a Sourcewell vendor, has submitted a proposal for systems maintenance and remediation services for all campuses utilizing contract #030421-JHN at a cost not to exceed \$77,489 for Fiscal Year 2024-2025, and
- **WHEREAS,** the cost for the same systems maintenance and remediation service for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 was \$74,134, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceed \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- **WHEREAS,** Sourcewell utilized competitive bidding for the awards of contracts to Johnson Controls US Holdings LLC Dba Johnson Controls Fire Protection LP,

- Milwaukee, WI thereby releasing UCNJ Union College of Union County, New Jersey from the requirement to obtain Pay-to-Play documentation, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;

- WHEREAS, the College currently utilizes the legal firm of Cleary Giacobbe Alfieri & Jacobs, LLC, Matawan, NJ as employment law counsel, including lead negotiator in bargaining unit talks and counsel for miscellaneous related matters, and
- WHEREAS, Cleary Giacobbe Alfieri & Jacobs, LLC, Matawan, NJ has submitted a proposal to provide legal counsel with respect to bargaining unit negotiations with faculty, labor law, and other miscellaneous legal matters at an hourly fee of \$215 for partner involvement, \$175 for associate involvement and \$90 for paralegal and law clerk involvement in an amount not to exceed \$180,000 for Fiscal Year 2024-2025, and
- **WHEREAS,** the cost for similar legal services for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 is projected to be \$170,000, and

- WHEREAS, the College has a need for a professional consulting firm and to utilize innovative technological tools for strategic enrollment management (SEM) activities and strategies to support recruitment and enrollment efforts, in support of the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a.(15) provides for an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids for professional consulting services, and
- **WHEREAS**, the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a.(19) provides an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids in the provision of goods or services for the use, support or maintenance of proprietary computer hardware, software peripherals and system development for the hardware, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a.(20) provides for an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids for professional recruitment and advertising, including without limitation advertising seeking student enrollment, and
- WHEREAS, EAB Global Inc., Washington, D.C. has submitted a multifaceted proposal as follows: for a one year period for enhancement of recruitment efforts which include a virtual tour on the website for \$16,500, and for the platforms Appily, which is an inquiry subscription that allows prospective students to engage in an interactive virtual experience for \$18,066, and Intersect which works with Naviance, a tool high school students and counselors utilize, and offers a professional landing page to highlight events and to virtually connect for \$17,200, for a total cost not to exceed \$51,766, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
