Resolution E025-024 - Public Safety Association/NJEA Contract

WHEREAS, the agreement between UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ ("College") and the Union County College Public Safety Association/NJEA (the "Association") expired on June 30, 2025, and

WHEREAS, the College and the Association have reached an agreement on a three-year contract for the period of July 1, 2025, to June 30, 2028, and

- **WHEREAS,** the agreement includes annual salary increases for bargaining unit members ranging from \$2,250 to \$3,750 in Year 1 (based on length of service), followed by 4.0% increases in Years 2 and 3, and
- WHEREAS, the revised contract also includes: an increase in meal allowance from \$8.00 to \$15.00; jury duty hours counting towards overtime eligibility; loss of eligibility for three consecutive overtime opportunities when accepted overtime is canceled within 48 hours of the scheduled start; access to holiday pay beginning at the time of hire; and sick time accrual of 8 hours per month; and vacation accrual of 6.66 hours per month, and other wording changes for clarity and administrative purposes, and
- **WHEREAS,** on September 2, 2025, the Association ratified the Memorandum of Agreement to a successor collective negotiations agreement with the College for the period of July 1, 2025, to June 30, 2028, and
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ approves the contract with the Union County College Public Safety Association/NJEA for the period of July 1, 2025, to June 30, 2028.

Resolution E025-025 - Union County College Staff Association/NJEA Contract

- **WHEREAS,** the agreement between UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ ("College") and the Union County College Staff Association/NJEA expired on June 30, 2024, and
- **WHEREAS,** the College and the Union County College Staff Association/NJEA have reached an agreement on a three-year contract for the period of July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2027, and
- **WHEREAS,** the contract includes annual salary increases for bargaining unit members as follows: a 4.0% raise plus \$0 to \$1,000 (based on length of service) in Year 1, a \$2,750.00 increase in Year 2, and a 4.0% in Year 3, and
- WHEREAS, the revised contract also includes: health insurance coverage transitioning from the State of New Jersey to the County of Union; reducing the required continuous employment period to access accrued vacation from six months to three months; extending the probationary period from 90 days to 180 days; and other wording changes for clarity and administrative purposes, and
- **WHEREAS,** on June 12, 2025, the Union County College Staff Association/NJEA ratified the contract with the College for the period of July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2027, and
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union

College of Union County, NJ approves the contract with the Union County College Staff Association/NJEA for the period of July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2027.

Resolution E025-026 - College Policies

- WHEREAS, UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ, as a comprehensive community college, has college-wide policies to ensure compliance with policy objectives and accountability, and
- WHEREAS, a College policy is a prescribed institutional course of action, a guiding principle, or a procedure intended to enhance strategic goals; reduce institutional risks; improve internal controls; establish delegation of authority and responsibility; promote compliance with federal, state and other applicable laws and regulations; further operational alignment, consistency, or efficiency; and/or influence and determine decisions, actions, conduct, and other matters at the College, and
- **WHEREAS**, the College's Policy on Policies sets forth that the Board of Trustees or the President serve as the "Approval Authority" for College-wide policies, and

Mr. Connolly stated that based on the data provided during the fiscal year 2024 financial assessment and monitoring cycle, UCNJ is classified as Least Risk.

Resolution F025-103 - ABLE PLUS Consortium Notice of Award

- **WHEREAS,** UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ, as a comprehensive community college, seeks to provide career occupational training programs designed to assist College students and other Union County residents to become employed, and
- WHEREAS, the College applied, as the lead agency of the WIOA Title II, ABLE PLUS Consortium, to the State of New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development, for funding under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, (Public Law 113-128) Title II, Adult Education and Family Literacy, and
- WHEREAS, the ABLE PLUS Consortium consists of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ, as the lead agency, and three public education partners; Elizabeth Board of Education, Literacy New Jersey Union County Program, and Urban Workforce Advantage Inc. for the purpose of delivering Adult Education, English Language Literacy and Civics Education programs that assist adults to become literate and obtain the knowledge and skills necessary for employment and economic self-sufficiency, and
- WHEREAS, UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ, as the lead agency, is responsible for overseeing the delivery of programs and services across the Consortium which include, Adult Basic Education, High School Diploma preparation, ESL, and Civics educational services to individuals who are unemployed, underemployed, in US Citizenship preparation or those who need to increase their basic skills and/or English proficiency to maintain employment, and
- **WHEREAS**, the College is expecting to service 254 clients for the duration of this program, and the Consortium is expected to service 397 clients in total, and
- WHEREAS, on August 18, 2025, the College received a Notice of Award from the State of New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development stating that the Consortium will be awarded \$1,668,095 with final determination contingent upon authorization and availability from the United States Federal Government, and
- WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development approved \$1,668,095 to the Consortium; the distribution of funds will include \$1,044,711 to UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ for the period July 1, 2025, to June 30, 2026;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ will accept \$1,668,095 from the State of New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development on behalf of the WIOA Title II, ABLE PLUS Consortium for the fiscal period July 1, 2025, to June 30, 2026.

Resolution F025-104 - Acceptance of Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG) Funds

- **WHEREAS,** UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ, is a comprehensive community college providing quality, affordable, accessible educational programs that serve the greater Union County region, and
- WHEREAS, the Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG) is the State of New Jersey's community college initiative that provides last dollar awards to students, with Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) between \$0 and \$65,000, to cover the cost of any remaining tuition and approved education fees after all other grants and scholarships have been applied. The grant will also enable students with AGI's between \$65,001 and \$100,000 to pay less in tuition and fees if they had previous CCOG awards, and
- WHEREAS, UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ has been notified that it was awarded \$184,405 for the Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG) Student Success Initiative funding to be implemented during the period July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026, by the State of New Jersey, Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE), and
- WHEREAS, the purpose of the partnership between the Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE) and the College is to increase matriculation and support the goals of the Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG) by implementing goals and strategies for capacity building and increasing enrollment, improving student completion and reducing financial burdens on students;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ accepts \$184,405 in funding from the State of New Jersey, Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE) for the Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG) Student Success Initiative Funding for the period July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026.

On motion duly made by Mr. Connolly, seconded by Mr. Katz and unanimously carried, the Board approved Resolutions F025-103 and F025-104 for adoption.

Contracts Exempt from Competitive Bidding

Resolution F025-105 - Electric Supply Service

- **WHEREAS,** electric supply service is necessary to provide power for the operations of all campuses, in support of the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.10. provides authority for joint purchasing by county colleges, municipalities, or counties or with other units of government pursuant to the "Local Public Contracts Law" (N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq.), and

- **WHEREAS,** the State of New Jersey Board of Public Utilities has provided that basic electric service be obtained through either bundled complete service from the regulated public utility or through a contracted commodity supply service delivered through the regulated services of the local power distribution company to the end user, and
- WHEREAS, the College has elected to obtain electric supply separately from the distribution service of the local power company and in coordination with the New Jersey Council of Community Colleges Joint Purchasing Consortium (NJCC JPC), and
- **WHEREAS,** Ocean County College acted as the lead agency for the NJCC JPC and initiated a publicly advertised bid for electric supply service, and
- WHEREAS, Constellation New Energy, Inc, Baltimore, MD submitted a proposal to provide electric supply service for two (2) primary accounts at a rate of \$.1293/kwh and fourteen (14) secondary accounts at a rate of \$.1309/kwh based on projected estimated usages for the period of September 2025 through August 2027, for a total estimated cost not to exceed \$1,923,384 based upon anticipated usage, and
- **WHEREAS**, the proposal's rate represents a 16.7% average rate increase from the previous contract period, and
- WHEREAS, on September 19, 2023, the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ awarded contracts to Constellation New Energy, Inc, Baltimore, MD to provide electric supply service for two (2) primary electric commodity supply service at a rate of \$.1096/kwh and fourteen (14) secondary accounts at a rate of .1134/kwh from September 2023 through August 2025, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that contracts arrived at through an open and fair process are exempt from the Pay-to-Play law, and
- WHEREAS, a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Chief Financial Officer;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ award contracts to Constellation New Energy, Inc, Baltimore, MD, for primary and secondary electric supply service from September 2025 through August 2027, at a total estimated cost not to exceed \$1,923,384.

Resolution F025-106 - Rental of Snow Removal Equipment and Van Rentals

WHEREAS, the College requires the rental of snow removal equipment to provide safe winter operations on the Cranford Campus as well as the rental of four (4) vans for the athletic department team travel for sports events, in support of day-to-day operations and the mission of the College, and

- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.11a.b. provides for an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids when there is a nationally recognized and accepted cooperative purchasing agreement for the product or service, and
- WHEREAS, a Request for Proposal (RFP) for snow removal equipment was issued to three (3) vendors, and two (2) proposals were received, with Herc Rentals Inc., Bonita Springs, FL providing the lowest responsible cost of \$87,300 under OMNIA contract #R200601 with the option to renew for an additional year, and
- **WHEREAS,** the cost of snow equipment rentals during the period from November 15, 2024, through April 15, 2025, was \$52,255 with the additional cost attributable to an extra loader added to the proposal, and
- WHEREAS, Herc Rentals Inc., Bonita Springs, FL has also submitted a proposal under OMNIA contact #2019000318 to provide two (2) 12 passenger and two (2) 15 passenger vans for travel to sporting events 90 minutes or less from the College for the period of September 17, 2025 December 31, 2025 at a cost not to exceed \$33,500, and

- WHEREAS, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS,** the Chief Financial Officer has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, OMNIA utilized competitive bidding for the award of the contract to Herc Rentals Inc., Bonita Springs, FL, thereby releasing UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ from the requirement to obtain Pay-to-Play such documentation, and
- WHEREAS, a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Chief Financial Officer;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ award contracts to Herc Rentals Inc., Bonita Springs, FL for the rental of snow removal equipment at the specified rates, at an annual cost of \$87,300 for Fiscal Year 2026 and \$33,500 for the rental of four (4) vans from the period of September 17, 2025- December 31, 2025.

Resolution F025-107 - Spend \$17,500-\$44,900

- WHEREAS, there exists a need throughout the College for goods or services, and
- **WHEREAS**, the attached purchases of goods and services are under the bid threshold of \$44,900, and
- WHEREAS, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS,** the Chief Financial Officer has determined that the individual contracts will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, the vendors provided information that exhibited compliance with the Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq., or the contracts were arrived at through an open and fair process thereby releasing UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ from the requirement to obtain such documentation, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Chief Financial Officer certifies that sufficient funds are available for the goods and services;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ award contracts between \$17,500 and \$44,900 to the listed vendors for a total spend of \$158,079.

On motion duly made by Dr. Tasharofi, seconded by Mr. Campbell and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.
