Resolution E024-030 - Union County College Employees Association Contract

- WHEREAS, the agreement between UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ ("College") and the Union County College Employees Association ("UCCEA") expired on June 30, 2023, and
- WHEREAS, the College and the UCCEA have reached an agreement on a four-year contract for the period of July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2027, at an increase of \$3,200 to base salary in Year 1 and an increase of 3.5% to base salary in Years 2-4, and
- WHEREAS, the revised agreement also reflects; increases to grade minimums and maximums consistent with base salary increases in Years 1-4; increases in the salary cap to \$94,999 from \$89,999; changes in health insurance to the County of Union from the State of New Jersey; access to accrued vacation after three months of continuous employment from six months; change in sick leave to accrual; and other wording changes for clarity and administrative purposes, and
- **WHEREAS,** on September 16, 2024, the UCCEA ratified the Memorandum of Agreement to a successor collective negotiations agreement with the College for the period of July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2027, and
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ approves the contract with the Union County College Employees Association for the period of July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2027.

On motion duly made by Mrs. Zimmermann, seconded by Dr. Tasharofi and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.

SAFETY REPORT

Dr. McMenamin stated that in compliance with the Cunningham – Ruiz Law (S485, codified at N.J.S.A. 18a:3B-71) requiring reporting of campus crimes and fire incidents for the period of May 29, 2024 through August 30, 2024, Public Safety advised that there was a theft of a forklift from Lot 2 which was reported to the Union County and Cranford Police Departments, and a theft from the Cranford campus Follett Bookstore which was reported to the Cranford Police Department.

BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

Mr. Connolly stated that the Budget and Finance Committee met earlier and reviewed the Investment Report and reported that all investments are found to be in order and are within acceptable norms.

Mr. Connolly stated that also reviewed was the Current Estimate Report and reported that at this time, a transfer to Unrestricted Net Position of \$1.4 million is anticipated for fiscal year ended June 30, 2025.

Resolution F024-081 - ABLE PLUS Consortium Funding Acceptance

- **WHEREAS,** UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ, as a comprehensive community college, seeks to provide career occupational training programs designed to assist College students and other Union County residents to become employed, and
- WHEREAS, the College applied, as the lead agency of the WIOA Title II, ABLE PLUS Consortium, to the State of New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development, for funding under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, (Public Law 113-128) Title II, Adult Education and Family Literacy, and
- WHEREAS, the ABLE PLUS Consortium consists of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ, as the lead agency, and three public education partners; Elizabeth Board of Education, Literacy New Jersey Union County Program, and Urban Workforce Advantage Inc. for the purpose of delivering Adult Education, English Language Literacy and Civics Education programs that assist adults to become literate and obtain the knowledge and skills necessary for employment and economic self-sufficiency, to become full partners in the educational development of their children or complete a secondary school education, transition to postsecondary education and training, through career pathways, and
- WHEREAS, UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ, as the lead agency, is responsible for overseeing the delivery of programs and services across the Consortium which include, Adult Basic Education, High School Diploma preparation, ESL, and Civics educational services to individuals who are unemployed, underemployed, in US Citizenship preparation or those who need to increase their basic skills and/or English proficiency to maintain employment, and
- **WHEREAS**, the College is expecting to service 713 clients for the duration of this program, and the Consortium is expected to service 1,153 clients in total, and
- WHEREAS, on June 20, 2024, the State of New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development notified UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ that the Consortium will be awarded \$1,879,927, and
- WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development approved \$1,879,927 to the Consortium; the distribution of funds will include \$1,139,000 to UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ for the period July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ accepts \$1,879,927 from the State of New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development on behalf of the WIOA Title II, ABLE PLUS Consortium for the fiscal period July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025.

<u>Resolution F024-082 - County of Union Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act</u> Funding

- WHEREAS, UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ, as a comprehensive community college, seeks to provide career occupational training programs designed to assist adult and dislocated worker employment and training activities for eligible residents of the County of Union and support the development of a strong globally competitive labor force, targeting the key growth sectors within New Jersey, and
- WHEREAS, the College applied to the County of Union for Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) funding to coordinate the Workforce Innovation Business Center (WIBC) to operate as an American Job Center Affiliate (AJCA) Career Service Center to provide job search, training, and job development services to eligible residents of the County to meet the needs of business by supporting local businesses and organizations in their recruitment of employees according to grant requirements, and
- WHEREAS, local employers will be able to leverage the resources of the College's occupational and workforce initiatives which will be carried out though the College's Center for Economic and Workforce Development (CEWD), the Industry Business Institute (IBI), and the Department of Continuing Education, and
- WHEREAS, an agreement was proposed by the County of Union whereby the College would take the lead on providing training that will support employers in health care, life sciences, financial services, advanced manufacturing, transportation, logistics and distribution, technology, entrepreneurship, retail, hospitality and tourism. The College has been selected by the County as the grant recipient and administrative entity for Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) funding, and
- WHEREAS, the County of Union approved, and the College received notification on June 19, 2024, that funding in the amount of \$500,000 was awarded for the period June 1, 2024, to June 1, 2025, which is allocated as follows: \$350,000, WIOA Dislocated Worker, and \$150,000, WIOA Adult;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ accepts \$500,000 in Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) funding from the County of Union under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) for the fiscal period June 1, 2024, to June 1, 2025.

On motion duly made by Mr. Connolly, seconded by Dr. Tasharofi and unanimously carried, the Board approved Resolutions F024-081 and F024-082 for adoption.

- **WHEREAS,** the College requires computers for the eSports program, Trinitas Learning Center and Academic Learning Center (ALC) in support of the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS**, the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5.a.(19) provides for an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids in the provision of goods or services for the use, support or maintenance of proprietary computer hardware, software peripherals and system development for the hardware, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.11a.a. authorizes County Colleges to be a participating contracting unit in a cooperative pricing system established pursuant to the laws of the State of New Jersey, and
- WHEREAS, on June 18, 2024, the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ awarded contracts to SHI International Corp., Somerset, NJ for software licenses, network maintenance and hardware at a total cost not to exceed \$1,875,515, and
- **WHEREAS,** SHI International Corp., Somerset, NJ has provided technological equipment at \$1,669 for Fiscal Year 2024-2025, which did not require Board of Trustee approval, and
- WHEREAS, SHI International Corp., Somerset, NJ has submitted proposals for the following:

- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS,** the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract awards will exceed \$17,500, and

- WHEREAS, NJEdge.Net utilized competitive bidding for the awards of their contracts to SHI International Corp., Somerset, NJ thereby releasing UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ from the requirement to obtain Pay-to-Play documentation, and
- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ award a contract to SHI International Corp., Somerset, NJ for computers for the e-Sports program, Trinitas Learning Center and ALC at a cost not to exceed \$24,383 for a total award not to exceed \$1,901,567 for Fiscal Year 2024-2025.

Resolution F024-084 - Professional Marketing Services

- **WHEREAS,** the College has a need for professional marketing services to increase enrollment through unified branding and advertising efforts and to publicly tout key academic programs, accomplishments, and strengths, in support of the mission of the College, and
- **WHEREAS,** the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A.18A:64A-25.5. a.(15) provides for an exception to the requirement of advertising for bids for professional consulting services, and
- WHEREAS, on March 19, 2024, the Board of Trustees awarded a contract to SG&W Integrated Marketing Communications Inc., Montville, NJ for integrated professional marketing service program for the period of July 1, 2024, through April 30, 2025, at a cost not to exceed \$250,000, and
- **WHEREAS**, the College wishes to extend the contract period through June 30, 2025, with no additional cost increase, and
- **WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the total contract award will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, SG&W Integrated Marketing Communications Inc., Montville, NJ has completed and submitted Business Entity Disclosure and Political Contribution Disclosure Certifications, certifying that they have not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the previous one year, and that they will be prohibited from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract, and

- **WHEREAS,** a Certification of Funds availability has been filed by the Vice President of Finance and Operations;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ awards an extension of the contract term extended through June 30, 2025, at no additional cost.

Resolution F024-085 - Spend \$17,500-\$41,600

- WHEREAS, there exists a need throughout the College for goods or services, and
- **WHEREAS**, the attached purchases of goods and services are under the bid threshold of \$41,600, and
- **WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4. et seq. provides that when the values of all contracts to a single vendor exceeds \$17,500 in the aggregate, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play Law, and
- **WHEREAS,** the Vice President of Finance and Operations has determined that the individual contracts will exceed \$17,500, and
- WHEREAS, the vendors provided information that exhibited compliance with the Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq., or the contracts were arrived at through an open and fair process thereby releasing UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ from the requirement to obtain such documentation, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Vice President of Finance and Operations certifies that sufficient funds are available for the goods and services;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ award contracts between \$17,500 and \$41,600 to the listed vendors for a total spend of \$99,804.

- **WHEREAS,** a request for proposals (RFP) was advertised in the Star Ledger, Newark, NJ on August 1, 2024 for collection agency services for the period of October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2026, and
- **WHEREAS**, the RFP invitation was distributed to twelve (12) prospective vendors and four (4) proposals were received and opened publicly on August 28, 2024, and
- **WHEREAS,** Allied Account Services, Inc., Bethpage, NY submitted the proposal most advantageous to the College, based on price and other weighted criteria, with a fee structure as provided below:

- WHEREAS, on September 20, 2022, the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ entered into a Permitted Use Agreement ("Agreement") for two years with Amateur Astronomers, Inc. ("AAI") under which it would be granted exclusive use of the Observatory during certain periods to engage in its study of Astronomy and related sciences, in exchange for it assuming responsibility, at its expense, for the care, maintenance and repair of the telescopes and equipment in the Observatory, and
- **WHEREAS**, the parties are desirous of extending the Permitted Use Agreement for a period of three years, and
- WHEREAS, Amateur Astronomers, Inc. ("AAI") agrees to the terms and conditions of the College's Facilities Use Guidelines that set forth the policy statements concerning external use including insurance requirements and recognition of the College's requirement that outside use not disrupt regular academic programs of the College, and
- **WHEREAS,** Amateur Astronomers, Inc. ("AAI") agrees to limited access of the Observatory through the College's Public Safety officers who will supervise entry and exit, and
- **WHEREAS,** nothing contained in the Agreement limits the use of the Observatory by the College including, but not limited to, modifications of the structure;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ approve and authorize a three-year extension of the Permitted Use Agreement with Amateur Astronomers, Inc. ("AAI"), under identical terms to those presented herein.

On motion duly made by Mr. Katz, seconded by Mr. Connolly and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Resolution for adoption.

OPEN MEETING TO THE PUBLIC

No one rose to address the Board.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS
