

Focus on Alumni



I Found a Community of Shared Learning as a Tutor at UCC's Academic Learning Center

When I was first offered a job as a tutor, I didn't know if I would have the time for it, but having had experience tutoring and teaching classes informally, I felt I could handle it. However, my perceptions did not prepare me for what the ALC had in store for me. In the end, the ALC felt less like a job to simply scribble down on a resume and instead became a community of shared learning.

For a socially reserved person, an early challenge for me was making the environment comfortable for tutees. Gail Hein, the ALC Director, explained the importance of making the tutoring center a warm and inviting experience. Gradually I began to find ways to open both the tutee and myself to the experience, and to make it a pleasing one.

Slowly those who would visit my table on a regular basis formed bonds with one another. I became so emotionally invested in these people that the reward of their efforts and achievements offset the modest monetary rewards. I still remember how on overwhelming days where I'd have two tables of students all needing my help, a tutee who was either in the same class or a higher-level class would help another while my attention was occupied elsewhere. I also formed social bonds with the other tutors, where we'd work as a team to help each other tutor effectively.

Of course, tutoring at the ALC was not always an easy task. Sometimes a student and I would not be on the same page and an explanation wouldn't click. We would then search for new

and different techniques to overcome the hurdle. Many times I found myself surrounded by a growing number of students where I'd only be able to help with one problem at time for hours on end. Still, in the end, to see the academic growth made all the effort worth it.

However, it needs to be understood that as a tutor it was never my job to "make someone smarter". Most of the time I found it was simply giving the time to students that felt neglected, and helping them to realize their own abilities. I came across brilliant writers who were not given the SAT grammar drilling exercises and mathematicians who only needed the confidence to be assured that their answers were right.

Many times I was learning along with them. Focusing on specific grammatical points and/or math problems I hadn't seen for a while helped strengthen my own academic work. When there was a comprehension disconnect it drove me to find new ways to explore certain problems that originally hadn't crossed my mind.

What is great about the ALC is it gives students who truly have the desire to succeed a chance. Whether it is because students can't connect with the professor's learning style, or are required to know something they don't have the background for, or they haven't been in school for a while, or maybe they just need the extra time, these disconnects are able to be resolved thanks to the ALC.

Some students put so much attention and passion into their academic success that I was at many times humbled by their work ethic. It made me realize that the people who will truly succeed in life are not those who easily slide through all the roads of life, but those who have relentless motivation and don't take success for granted. Sometimes they just need an extra boost.

The Academic Learning Centers (ALC) on the Cranford, Elizabeth and Plainfield Campuses offer tutors in almost all credit courses taught at UCC, with special emphasis on high-risk courses. Liza Singer of Short Hills, NJ was a peer tutor at the Academic Learning Center in Cranford. She is now a student at the Gallatin School at NYU.






