Simulation Lab Makes UCC a Leader in Paramedic

Training

When a medical emergency occurs, you rely on the expertise of the responding Paramedics. Since 1982, Union

County College has been utilizing new and innovative methods of training it its paramedic program so that New Jersey residents receive the best possible care. Today, the Freda and Robert N. Brown Paramedic Program is the only regional paramedic training program in the state, offering training to 15 of the 21 paramedic health systems in NJ.

What makes UCC's program so unique is its method of preparing and promoting safety for students and patients through the use of a medical simulation lab. Medical simulation is a state of the art technique used in training students when real life experience is either too expensive or too risky. It has been proven to reduce medical errors, allowing students to practice a difficult patient case or rare condition, and offers a forum for students to apply learned material before interacting with live patients.

UCC's simulation lab was conceived by Professor Jennifer McCarthy, Paramedic Program Director. "I have

always trained my graduates to a level of comfort that if they responded to treat my family, I would be happy to see them walk to my front door. With the added use of the medical simulation lab, I can fully assess their performance in a way that I could not in the past. I can make the environment mimic real life stressors that can distract paramedics during an emergency. My teaching and mentoring ability has catapulted to a level that I could never imagine through the use of medical simulation."

On the Plainfield Campus, the Emergency Health Science Lab (EHS Lab) has been expanded to a fully functional medical simulation lab. The lab now houses two computerized mannequins that provide students with interactive patient experiences.

The lab expansion included a sound proof wall to enable the area to be divided into two patient treatment rooms.

Each room holds three video cameras that interact with an audio visual system to professionally record a student's performance during assessment of the mannequins.

A control room has been added, where the faculty programs the mannequins. Each room allows two-way communication between the students and faculty in the control room. The new state of the art lab was made possible by grant funding from the Carl P. Perkins and Department of Labor grants.

The EHS Lab is one of a kind in the tri-state area, offering graduates a unique training experience to prepare them for the uncertainty that the paramedic field offers.
