

What Has Brown Done for UCC?

Since Dr. Thomas Brown was chosen to be UCC's seventh President in 1990, Union County College has undergone dramatic changes and improvements. When Dr. Brown arrived from upstate New York, UCC had the present suburban Cranford campus but a less robust urban presence. At that time classes in Elizabeth were held in a warehouse by the docks, and the Plainfield campus consisted of only one building and served a mere 168 students. Dr. Brown negotiated the agreement with UMDNJ that resulted in today's cooperative use of the Scotch Plains campus.

Today Union County College boasts four lively campuses, offers over 90 programs of study, and 70 articulation agreements with four-year colleges.

A few statistics help tell the story of UCC's growth in the past 17 years under Dr. Brown's leadership:

- Total enrollment rose 51% from 22,836 to 34,521.
- The number of financial aid recipients more than tripled and the monies received more than quintupled.
- Students enrolled full time in credit programs increased 48%.
- The College budget increased 76% (\$30.8 million to \$54 million).
- Computer labs increased from 9 to 57, and computer user accounts increased from 350 to 18,000.
- The UCC Foundation endowment increased from \$1,900,000 to over \$10,600,000.
- The UCC and UCC Foundation Capital Campaign raised

\$8,005,732, the largest total by any county college in New Jersey.

Twice – in 1997 and 2007 – Dr. Brown has overseen a comprehensive self-study of the entire institution in preparation for reaffirmation of accreditation by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education.

Ten years ago the College received the highest possible rating, and this spring the visiting team of academics determined that UCC has met or exceeded all 14 of their standards of excellence in higher education, labeling the College "a leader among its peers".

Union County and the College community are fortunate in the vision and leadership of Dr. Brown. The next years will see the fruition of his dream of an expanded Elizabeth campus with a beautiful new \$54 million building that will more than double its capacity to serve students. **U**

Faculty Focus

Dr. Denise C. Lagos

For the Love of Learning

As a little girl, Denise Katsafados loved to play school and always knew that she would become a teacher. "I always had that instinct to share my knowledge," she explained.

Dr. Lagos has an insatiable craving for education. Since receiving her undergraduate degree in Spanish from Fairleigh Dickinson University in 1973 and her Master's of Teaching from Montclair State College in 1975, she earned several certifications and four additional degrees, most recently a Master's of Letters in Literature & Fine Arts from Drew University in 2006. In addition to her doctorate in education, she holds two Master's of Education degrees from Rutgers University - one in Administration and

Supervision in Higher Education

(1994), the other in Reading (1990).

Asked why she has earned so many

degrees, she answered, "With anything that I do, I want the credentials to back me up. I've always thrived on knowledge and I know that

what I learned a year ago may be obsolete 10 years down the road. I need to learn whatever is new. It is important for me to keep abreast of whatever is going on in education."

Dr. Lagos is quick to credit her parents, who always stressed the importance of education. She speaks with heartfelt thanks about her parents and maternal grandmother who were her role models. Her father, a mechanical engineer, and her mother, a banker, were always very supportive. "I used to eat myself up whenever I didn't get an A, but my parents would tell me that I did my best and that's all you can do ... I would always ask myself why I was the lucky one to have the best mom and dad in the world."

A Senior Professor of English (ESL), Dr. Lagos has taught at UCC

since 1980 and has been involved in many faculty activities. Since 1986 she has been Editor and Advisor of The Foreign

Student Voice. This popular publication includes writing and art of students in English as a Second Language and English classes. She explains proudly, "We've had up to 83 countries represented ...The Foreign Student Voice represents what our students are capable of doing and I'm very passionate about it. It's good PR for our college because anyone can pick this up and understand what our program is all about."

Dr. Lagos has lived in Chatham, New Jersey since the age of 12. Her children are named after her parents: Louis works in computer engineering and Penelope is an actress. She smiles when she speaks of her husband of 31 years, Harry, who emigrated from Greece. "He owned his first business when he was just 17 years old and has been an entrepreneur ever since."

Although she has been honored many times, receiving the 2000 Woman of Excellence Award for Higher Education from Union County's Commission on the Status of Women meant the most to her.

What does she like most about teaching? Dr. Lagos asserts that her students are what make everything she does worthwhile. "I love the interaction with students, "she explained. "I learn from all of my students, especially about their culture. I learn as much from them as they do from me...The students are what make me get up in the morning and want to come here. I have wonderful students and it is a pleasure to work here at Union County College."

Will Dr. Lagos pursue yet another degree? "I don't know, but you never know with me!". One thing is certain her life-long love affair with knowledge will never end.


