
Celebrating the College's 75th Anniversary

The UCC Foundation's 16th Annual Gala, that was held on October 25, 2008, celebrated the 75th anniversary of the founding of Union County College. Stormy weather failed to dampen the spirits of the more than 300 guests at this celebratory affair. The Victor M. Richel Student Commons was transformed into an elegant, art-deco styled ballroom, where guests enjoyed gourmet dining, music by Carrie Jackson and her Swinging Jazz Quartet, casino games and a "Diamond Hunt." The event raised \$165,000 for scholarships and innovative programs.

The Gala video highlighted UCC's history and saluted TD Bank (formerly Commerce Bank) and Merck & Co., Inc., as *Diamond Anniversary Sponsors*. Then the Chair of the College's Board of Trustees, Victor M. Richel, in a surprise announcement, declared that the fifth floor of the building under construction on the Elizabeth campus, the Elizabeth I. Kellogg Building, will be named the *Dr*. *Thomas H. Brown Center for Business & Educational Advancement.*



Trinitas School of Nursing Receives National Recognition


With enrollment nearing 2,000 students, Trinitas School of Nursing is among the largest nursing school in the country. In September it was designated as an NLN (National League for Nursing) Center of Excellence in Nursing Education for 2008 – 2011, one of six schools of nursing in the country to be so honored, and one of 13 schools to currently hold this honor.

Trinitas is the first school in New Jersey and the first Cooperative Nursing Program in the nation to receive this award, which was presented to Dean Mary Elizabeth Kelley and members of the faculty at the NLN's Education Summit on September 20, 2008 in San Antonio, Texas. Trinitas was cited as a school with a demonstrated commitment to excellence, one that has invested resources to distinguish itself in nursing education.

In 2007 Trinitas was the first in the US to have 100% of its eligible faculty certified with the NLN Certification in Nursing Education (CNE) credential. Established in 1891 as the Elizabeth General Hospital School of Nursing, for 36 years, since 1972, it has maintained a formal Cooperative Nursing Program with Union County College. Students receive a Diploma in Nursing from Trinitas and an Associate in Science degree from the College. The Trinitas School of Nursing will occupy an entire floor of the soon to be completed Elizabeth I. Kellogg Building in Elizabeth. 🍺

Happy 75th Birthday, UCC!

October 15, 2008 marked 75 years of excellence in higher education for Union County College. This college was the first of six Emergency Relief

Administration projects founded in New Jersey by President Franklin D. Roosevelt to provide jobs for unemployed teachers during the Great Depression.

The celebration began with presentations by History Department faculty Dr. Alison Brown, Dr. Lawrence Hogan, and Dr. Philip Papas, then featured a rousing folk concert, birthday cake, and a procession to place a wreath at the FDR oak in the campus History Grove. As a special touch, the cafeteria menu featured hot dogs and other foods served to the King and Queen of England by President and Mrs. Roosevelt in 1939.
