undreds of other people, though, attended Union and earned enough credits to graduate but never got around to filling out the piece of paper to make it official. In other words, they completed the courses they needed for an associate degree or certificate but never closed the deal by actually applying for graduation.

Some, too, are Union County College graduates but they don't even know it.

For what may be an extreme example of the latter phenomenon, meet Alan Pitts. He took his first class at Union in 1975. He completed more than 60 hours of credit course work and then

Alan served his country with distinction. Soon after returning to civilian life, life got in the way of his finishing college. He got married, began having children, and joined the police force in his hometown of Rahway. After 16 years of service as a police officer, he retired in 2002.

As a retiree, Alan dabbles in real estate and serves the community as a volunteer soccer coach.

Then one day Alan happened to meet one of his former Criminal Justice professors who is still teaching at Union County College. Professor Mark Singer told him, "You should really go back and finish your associate degree and maybe even go on for a bachelor's degree."

Alan considered Dr. Singer's advice and also thought about the example he would be setting for his three children. "I want them to see that you need to complete something you start."

Alan contacted Union County College's Dean of Students Jo Ann Davis-Wayne, who enlisted College Registrar Nina Hernandez and Director of Advisement, Career and Transfer Services Heather Keith.

His official graduation date is Aug. 31, 2014. He is welcome to participate in the College's Commencement Ceremonies and says, "I wouldn't miss it for the world."

We suspect he'll be attending the January 14, 2015, ceremony in Cranford. This year, for the first time in Union's 81-year history, the College has begun holding Commencement in both January and May.

Alan's message to his fellow Union County College alumni is the same he has for his children: "A College education is something no one can ever take away from you."

His future plans: "I think I want to move on to get my bachelor's degree, also in Criminal Justice."

Alan has one important caveat, though. "For the bachelor's, though, I don't think I can afford to wait another 35 years to complete my degree."
