UCNJ History

UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ has a remarkable history as the oldest of New Jersey's community colleges. The College began in 1933 as a one-room night school and is now a comprehensive community college serving almost 12,000 credit and noncredit students in Union County.

U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt The College's fact founded Union County Junior College as an "emergency junior college" through the federal Works Project Administration with the original mission of providing jobs for unemployed teachers and professors.

UCNJ is an open-access community college that currently offers over 60 associate degrees and certificate programs, as well as noncredit opportunities. The College has campuses in Cranford, Elizabeth, Plainfield, and Scotch Plains. In addition to in-person classes, the College offers online courses and more than 20 fully-online degree programs.

The Cranford Campus expanded in 2016 with the two-story Student Development Building, which houses student services on the first floor in the Helen E. Chaney Student Services Center, named for the generous donor and alumna Helen Chaney, '48. The second floor has classrooms and faculty offices.

In June 2017, UCNJ's accreditation was reaffirmed by The Middle States Commission on Higher Education, a voluntary, non-governmental, membership association that defines, maintains, and promotes educational excellence.

On the Elizabeth Campus, renovations to the Lessner Building were completed in 2018. This included the development of a new Student Services Center on the first floor and offices and training classrooms on the lower level for the College's Center for Economic and Workforce Development. The impact of Hurricane Ida in September 2021 left the Kellogg Building closed for a full year after severe flooding damage, with operations moved to the Lessner Building or other campuses. The Kellogg Building reopened in fall 2022.

In January 2020, renovations on the Health Science Building on the Plainfield Campus were completed, adding state-of-the-art facilities and labs for the paramedic emergency health science, physical therapist assistant, and respiratory care programs before the COVID-19 pandemic hit the United States.

While COVID-19 impacted the way in which the College operated and delivered education, the College's commitment to its mission remained unchanged.

In 2022, the College was named a semifinalist for the 2023 Aspen Prize. This acknowledged UCNJ as one of the top 25 community colleges in the United States! This was the first time the College received this recognition. The College was chosen for this honor among more than 1,000 community colleges nationwide based upon having high and improving levels of student success as well as equitable outcomes for Black and Hispanic students and those from lower-income backgrounds.

In 2022, the College's Scotch Plains Campus reopened as a destination campus and reimagined as a University Center and home to the College's virtual campus. Located on the same property with the Union County Vocational Technical Schools and John H. Stamler Police Academy, this destination campus is an opportunity for students to take both credit and non-credit courses or pursue a four-year degree with one of the College's university partners in a newly renovated state-of-the-art space.

On July 1, 2022, the College underwent a rebranding with a new name and logo. UCNJ Union College of Union County, NJ blazed the community with a logo that represents the flame in Fiat Lux, and a U shape. Adopting the name UCNJ moves the College into the future, while showcasing academic excellence and national recognition.

In fall 2023, the College was named one of the top 150 community colleges for 2025 in the U.S. by the Aspen Prize Institute College Excellence Program. This is the College's third consecutive recognition as a Top 150 Community College.

With each new program, opportunity, and modern space for learning, the College is fulfilling our mission of transforming our community...one student at a time!



The College Mace Seal

The pomp and ceremony of a UCNJ Commencement traditionally includes a procession led by a senior faculty member carrying a mace. The mace served as a weapon in medieval times, however, the mace as a symbol of civil authority dates to the mid 13th century. Since the 1500s, colleges and universities have used the mace as part of academic regalia in formal ceremonies.

The mace symbolizes the authority of the Board of Trustees, the Board of Governors, and the Office of the President of UCNJ, and also represents the faculty's consent in conferring degrees and certificates.

The UCNJ mace is 38 inches long and sculpted from a solid piece of walnut. The triangular carvings at the base of its shaft reflect the tripartite interaction among research, education, and innovation, which are key drivers of a knowledge-based society. The upper portion of the mace features the round Seal of UCNJ with the "Fiat Lux" motto, which is Latin for "Let There Be Light." The head of the mace also displays the College Owl, the mascot that symbolizes the College's 1933 origin when it was a night school for unemployed teachers.



The College Seal, shown at the right, is the original design used in 1933 when the College was founded.

The seal is used primarily for official events such as commencement. The College's motto, "Fiat Lux," which is translated "let there be light," is engraved on the seal along with a torch. The implication of the motto is that to be educated is to let in the light thus dispelling the darkness of ignorance.





c Colors

ADEMIC Attire

The origins of academic dress date back to the 12th and 13th centuries, when universities were taking form. The ordinary dress of the scholar, whether student or teacher, was that of a cleric. Formal academic attire is an important part of the pageantry of modern day commencement ceremonies.

A college commencement is a colorful celebration of student excellence and achievement. In academic processions each color is a symbol.

Gowns

The associate gown is black, as is the gown for certificate candidates. This gown, like the bachelor's gown, has pointed sleeves and is worn closed.

Other gowns are black with few exceptions. The master's degree gown has an oblong sleeve, open at the wrist, and may be worn open or closed. The gown for a doctoral degree has bell-shaped sleeves, is worn open or closed, and is embellished with velvet crossbars on the sleeves. Doctoral gowns may be colored to represent a particular institution.

Cowls

Academic cowls identify the degree attained. The color of the cowl a student wears reflects the degree or certificate the graduate is receiving:

- Associate in Arts Degree: Black, Gold and White;
- Associate in Applied Science Degree: Black, Red and White;
- Associate in Science Degree: Black, Blue and White;
- · Certificate: Black, Green and Gold.

Bachelor's, master's and doctoral hoods feature velvet edging in the color of the discipline and a lining in the color of the institution.

Caps and Tassels

UCNJ graduates wear a black mortarboard and the tassel indicates academic achievement.

Students wearing red tassels on their mortarboards have achieved an overall Grade Point Average of 3.75 or better. Students wearing white tassels on their mortarboards have a Grade Point Average of 3.25 or better. The tassel is worn on the right side until the formal conferral of the degree. At that time the tassel is moved to the left.

Honors

Degree candidates who have been awarded honors in scholarship are distinguished by colored stoles, satin panels draped over the shoulders. Stoles or cords are worn as an accessory to graduation robes and have special meaning:

- Gold stoles and blue and gold cords are worn by members of Phi Theta Kappa, the international honor society of two-year colleges;
- Green stoles are worn by members of Tau Alpha Pi, the national honor society for engineering technology;
- Green stoles are also worn by members of the Engineering and Architecture Honor Society;
- Burgundy stoles are worn by members of Mu Alpha Theta, the two-year college mathematics honor society;
- White and Gold stoles are worn by members of American Honors, UCNJ's honors program;
- Red and Black stoles are worn by members of the NJ STARS program;
- White and Red stoles are worn by members of the Educational Opportunity Fund program;
- Black and Red stoles are also worn by student-athletes;
- Black and Silver cords are worn by members of The National Society of Leadership and Success;
- Blue and White cords are worn by members of Chi Alpha Epsilon, the national academic honor society for the Educational Opportunity Fund.
- Rainbow cords are worn by members of Inspire the Future.

Colors

For all academic purposes, including the trim of doctoral gowns, the edging hoods, and the tassels of caps, the colors associated with the different disciplines are as follows:
